Oliver, Arlington, Allentown, Knoxville, Beltzhoover or the South Side. Qualified seniors provide a health history, medication history and discuss functional limitations and from that, the Care Coordinator determines the kind of services that a senior will need to continue to live independently; and,

WHEREAS, this year, the **UPMC Living-at Home Program** will celebrate its 25th Anniversary and will honor its success at a Luncheon at Shadyside Hospital's Herberman Conference Center on Friday, September 28, 2012; and,
