As per the Resolution 876 of 2018, which authorizes City Council to approve intra-departmental transfers throughout the 2019 Fiscal Year, the Office of Management and Budget would like to make the following transfer(s):

This transfer is needed to align budgeted funds to the proper spending accounts that are connected to contracts for vehicles and assets. The funding in the Machinery & Equipment line will be used to purchase a SkyWatch mobile surveillance tower and the funding in the Vehicles line will be used to purchase a Kawasaki vehicle to move supplies at the Police stables.
