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Scope of Services

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Background

The City of Pittsburgh's Department of Mobility and Infrastructure (DOMI) is undertaking transportation studies in neighborhoods across the City. These studies, which may be prepared in conjunction with larger neighborhood planning efforts led by the City's Department of City Planning (DCP), will be designed to address the mobility and parking challenges and opportunities unique to subject neighborhood(s) and larger districts across the City. The general scope of work and technical skills required for successful completion of neighborhood transportation studies are common across all studies; however, emphasis of tasks within the scope of work may vary with the assigned study area.

DOMI is soliciting a consulting firm or team of firms with appropriate expertise and innovative approaches in transportation planning, design, engineering, operations and management of multimodal networks and shared parking resources to submit proposals to prepare a Neighborhood Transportation Study and implementation strategy.

DOMI intends to award multiple contracts for individual neighborhoods as a result of this solicitation. Each firm or team of firms that is awarded a contract will then refine their scope of work for the specific neighborhood or larger district for which they will be conducting the study. The intent of each study is to design a multimodal transportation network and management strategy that provides safe, enjoyable, and sustainable integrated mobility for all users while also promoting and enabling local (re)development and economic growth.

Geographic neighborhoods of study may include:

1. Hill District – Crawford-Roberts, Middle Hill, Bedford Dwellings, Terrace Village, and Upper Hill
2. Greater Oakland – East Oakland, West Oakland, North Oakland, and South Oakland
3. Areas of comparable size.

Scope Details

The scope of work encompasses and integrates six distinct components:

1. A multimodal network study that will support the existing community, instill development, and anticipated growth.
2. An analysis of vehicular capacity and operations, including trip generation forecasting for planned and potential development, transportation demand management (TDM) strategies, City and regional capacity needs in the network, and street and intersection operational improvements, among others.
3. A shared parking management strategy that will optimize both publicly and privately held parking resources to support the reduced provision of parking. This should also include a curbside management strategy.
4. An analysis of transit and local circulators, including both public transit and existing or prospective local circulator transit services provided by the Port Authority of Allegheny County (PAAC), the City, or district stakeholders, and any other publicly available micromobility, shared mobility, or other shared public mobility services existing or expected.
5. An evaluation of non-motorized networks, including pedestrian facilities and connectivity, to determine if the network is adequate to provide for a high quality, all ages, and ability network in accordance with the City's objective to eliminate traffic related deaths and serious injuries.
6. A clear implementation strategy with estimated budgetary, operational, and organizational needs for the next three to five years. This may include proposals for benefit capture and other financial mechanisms as well as a prioritized and phased implementation strategy.

The firm or team of firms will need to work in a collaborative manner with multiple city agencies and a diverse mix of stakeholders, including local merchants, property owners, residents, and advocates. The study should be driven by both quantitative and qualitative data and balance competing needs to deliver a complete and sustainable network.

The following is a generalized baseline scope of work to be used in initial consultant ranking and selection. It is anticipated that, if selected and consequently assigned a study area location, the consultant will refine their scope of work to reflect unique needs of assigned study area. The consultant may also augment their team, including minority- and women-owned business (M / WBE) participation, to appropriately meet the neighborhood or larger district needs.

Task 1. Project Management & Initiation

The purpose of this task is to ensure a coordinated and efficient process that will result in timely and thorough deliverables that address the scope of work. At the onset of the project, the consultant will prepare a detailed work plan, including a project schedule with milestones, to ensure that the project approach is clearly understood and agreed to by all parties. This task also provides for coordination and collaboration between and among the consultant, DOMI, and other relevant parties who may be working on other transportation- or development-related activities in the neighborhood or larger district.

Task 1 Deliverables. Deliverables associated with this task include (1) a project management approach, (2) a schedule including major milestones, (3) confirmation of project goals, objectives, and products, and (4) a submission, review, and revision process.

Task 2. Stakeholder Involvement / Public Engagement & Outreach

The purpose of this task is to obtain valuable input from a range of stakeholders and the general public to define critical outcomes of the study and performance metrics for the network. The consultant should anticipate that interested parties will include but not be limited to businesses, property owners, residents, people who use bicycles, transit riders, pedestrians, motorists, commercial drivers, business patrons, and visitors. Stakeholders to be engaged will include a diversity of races, cultural backgrounds, ages, physical abilities, and other factors that may require unique engagement approaches and sensitivity toward accommodation.

This task has two components – stakeholder involvement and public engagement. As part of the larger neighborhood planning process, a steering committee will be assembled by the City at the onset of the project. The steering committee will be comprised of community stakeholders who represent a diverse pool of organizations and groups. As the planning process advances, the steering committee will form a mobility-specific action team. The action team will be comprised of City and other agency staff, local transportation partners, and residents, among others. It is the intention that this team will help guide the policies, projects, and programs set forth in the Neighborhood Transportation Study and implementation strategy. Action team meetings will be led by DOMI staff; however, the consultant is expected to participate. The consultant should anticipate attending two to three of these meetings in person and another five to six via phone or web interface.

The second component of this task includes public engagement and outreach. Unique engagement strategies will be necessary to reach and to engage a diverse range of organizations, individuals, and interest groups with a stake in the study and outcomes. The consultant will be responsible for all aspects of outreach and engagement including logistics, material preparation, facilitation, and documentation, etc. Creative and out-of-the-box strategies to capture input from traditionally underrepresented perspectives is encouraged.

Task 2 Deliverables. Deliverables associated with this task include (1) a public engagement and outreach strategy, (2) meeting materials, and (3) written summaries of all action team meetings in addition to engagement activities and information gathered.

Task 3. Data Collection and Existing and Draft Forecast Conditions

The purpose of this task is to collect, organize, review, and analyze current transportation, commuting patterns, land use, and other pertinent data and plans / studies to better understand existing conditions, trends, and deficiencies in the study area. At the onset of the project, DOMI will provide a list of all relevant studies, plans, and supporting information.

The consultant will identify, collect, and create, as needed, a compilation of data to analyze existing and future transportation needs for the study area. The consultant will identify data needs and gaps. The City, Southwest Pennsylvania Commission (SPC), Public Parking Authority of Pittsburgh (PPAP), Port Authority of Allegheny County (PAAC), and Western Pennsylvania Regional Data Center (WPRDC) will serve as the primary data clearinghouses for this scope of work. The consultant will be responsible for augmenting and validating data, as necessary, as well as all modeling and analysis.

This task will result in a baseline understanding of existing and forecasted demand patterns of all travel modes and trip purposes in the study area. The existing conditions and needs analysis as it relates to multimodal transportation will identify areas of conflict between modes, congestion, safety concerns, and other relative measures. The use of data sets such as Streetlight data, which will be made available through project partner(s), is strongly encouraged. This task shall also confirm desired and anticipated outcomes of area improvements and draft performance measures for tracking and reporting measures of success.

Data compiled and analyzed as part of this task should include but not be limited to the following:

- Past and current studies, plans, and activities.
- Bidirectional traffic volumes / classification for AM, midday, and PM weekday and Saturday peak hour, travel time / average speed for significant corridors.
- Turning movement counts as required for analyzing current and future traffic conditions
- Cordon counts and general assessment of origins and destinations to determine locally destined versus through travel trips.
- Bike and pedestrian counts.
- Transit stop boarding and alighting.
- Crash data and safety analysis.
- Inventory of crosswalks and sidewalks dimensions and conditions, including incursions onto the pedestrian zone (e.g. parking), inventory of bicycle travel and parking facilities, and transit stop locations and conditions.

- Curbside regulations inventory and utilization report (e.g. parking, commercial loading, drop off, etc.).
- Off-street and on-street parking supply and utilization.
- Existing and forecasted demographic information, land use, and development.
- Commuting information and mode.
- Mode of access for retail and destination patrons.
- Existing network map including street distributions and directions, trails, and transit routes.
- Asset condition inventory map (pavement, bridges, etc.) including unique conditions such as exposed rails.

Task 3 Deliverables. Deliverables associated with this task shall include a (1) data collection plan and methodology, (2) data inventory summary, (3) summary of relevant studies, plans, and activities, (4) draft existing conditions report, (5) draft transportation and parking demand forecast, and (6) tabulated data sets and GIS data layers.

Task 4. Parking and Transportation Demand Management Best Practices

The consultant will prepare a short technical memorandum that showcases best practices in relevant parking and transportation demand management (TDM) policies and programs, including but not limited to:

- Parking management district / shared parking district.
- Performance-based parking management.
- Performance-based curbside management (e.g. performance based loading zones, loading management programs, etc.).
- Local circulators (public and private).
- Employer- and worker-based transportation demand management.

It is anticipated that findings identified in the technical memorandum will be translated into best practices fact sheets for stakeholders and the general public.

Task 4 Deliverables. Deliverables associated with this task include (1) a short technical memorandum, (2) a best practices fact sheets for area stakeholders, and (3) a summary PowerPoint for web distribution.

Task 5. Multimodal Network Plan

Building from previous studies, the consultant will develop a multimodal network plan that includes but may not be limited to:

- An alternatives analysis of and recommendations for a prioritized modal network. Intersection and linear improvements / multimodal facilities, including type of facility, bicycle alignments, and options to improve transit services, stops, or connections should also be considered. The analysis should evaluate current transit utilization, barriers to use, opportunities for more transit-oriented development (and / or development-oriented transit), and passenger waiting facilities, among others. It will be important to consider the City's existing public bike share system as well as emerging private bikeshare and other shared personal mobility options.

- An analysis of and recommendation for directional street operations (one-way / two way) and stop controls.

Task 5 Deliverables. Deliverables associated with this task include (1) a summary of alternatives evaluated, (2) evaluation metrics and scores, and (3) a draft multimodal network plan.

Task 6. Parking and Transportation Demand Management Strategy

The consultant will develop a parking and TDM strategy, which identifies solutions for on- and off-street parking and curbside management, a recommended shared parking program structure, incentives and support, TDM incentives, and recommended management structure for implementation.

The parking component should consider the following:

- On-street curbside resources – the examination of current curbside regulations (or lack thereof), existing and forecasted curbside demand and use and change / transition over time, and efficient and effective management strategies and organizational structures, monitoring and enforcement.

- Off-street parking resources – the examination of both public and private resources, ownership, use, access, vehicular trip generation and associated traffic impacts, security and liability concerns, revenue generation and fee collection and management, and enforcement, among others.

- Identify a structure and / or mechanisms for implementing a shared parking program.

The TDM strategy should build off those that are preferred by the City to the extent feasible and appropriate as well as applicable best practices identified in Task 4. It should identify strategies and incentives as well as a tiered approach for implementation.

Task 6 Deliverables. Deliverables associated with this task include a draft parking and TDM strategy.

Task 7. Implementation Plan and Final Report

The purpose of this task is to finalize materials of the Neighborhood Transportation Study and implementation strategy. The implementation strategy should focus on a three to five year time horizon and include specific policy and infrastructure implementation guidance, including estimated cost and funding as relevant.
