Legislative Monitoring and Reporting

Malady & Wooten monitors all legislative action in Harrisburg which may impact the City of Pittsburgh and its related authorities.

Malady & Wooten compiles and submits comprehensive City of Pittsburgh legislative reports weekly to the Mayor's Office. The weekly report contains the General Assembly's session schedule, a listing of all relevant legislation introduced in the General Assembly along with any legislative action, and all relevant state news.

Malady & Wooten provides updates to city officials either in person or via telephone weekly on issues of importance in Harrisburg, while providing ongoing input into the City's government affairs planning.

Lobbying the Governor's Administration and the General Assembly

Malady & Wooten facilitates and participates in meetings with members of the General Assembly, legislative staff, administration officials and other parties of interest on a regular basis in an effort to support the City of Pittsburgh's legislative priorities.

Working to Support the City's Legislative Priorities

Malady & Wooten advises the City regarding the development of specific administrative, legislative and regulatory strategies and proposals. And Malady & Wooten works to support, oppose or amend legislation as necessary. Below are several examples of our recent work on the City's behalf:

Elimination of State Oversight

- Malady & Wooten worked with the Governor's Office and DCED to coordinate the City's exit from Act 47 state oversight.
- Malady & Wooten worked with Senator Jay Costa's office on the introduction of SB 1047
 which would require the Secretary of DCED to terminate the Intergovernmental
 Cooperation Authority (ICA). Malady & Wooten is now actively lobbying legislative leaders
 to move this legislation. It is expected to pass the Senate by June of 2018.

Pittsburgh Water & Sewer Authority

- Malady & Wooten has worked with the Governor's Office and DEP to maintain an open line of communication throughout the ongoing issues and challenges at PWSA.
- Malady & Wooten worked with Legislative Leaders, Committee Chairs, rank and file
 members of the General Assembly, the Governor's Office and Public Utility Commission
 (PUC) staff to coordinate the City's advocacy surrounding HB1490 (Turzai) which provides
 for PUC Oversight of PWSA. Malady & Wooten worked with the Mayor's Office and
 PWSA to draft and insert amendments into HB1490 that made the legislation more
 favorable to the City and PWSA.
- Malady & Wooten lobbied Legislative Leaders, rank and file members of the General
 Assembly and the Governor's Office in a successful effort to insert amendatory language
 into the 2017 Fiscal Code (HB 674) that now allows PWSA to replace private water and
 sewer laterals from the curb to the home or business. This change allows the PWSA to
 replace entire lead lateral lines without having to sever them.

- Malady & Wooten has communicated with Rep. Dom Costa regarding his proposed legislation to place to PWSA under state oversight.
- Malady & Wooten was contacted by PUC staff and has worked to connect and coordinate PUC and PWSA officials leading up to formal PUC oversight of PWSA on April 1, 2018.
- Malady & Wooten worked to get Dr. Karen Hacker as a joint representative for the City of Pittsburgh and Allegheny County on the State Lead Task Force and Advisory Committee (Yudichak SR33)
- Malady & Wooten advocated for the Senate's passage of lead in water related legislation:
 - SB296 Fontana Real Estate Disclosure of Lead in Water and Paint
 - SB639 Fontna Making private water and sewer lines eligible PennVEST funding

Housing & Tenants Rights

- Malady & Wooten is currently working on drafting a co-sponsorship memo in coordination with Senator Costa and Representative Gainey to establish a Longtime Owner Occupant Program (LOOP) for Cities of the Second Class.
- Malady & Wooten is currently working with Representative Killion to ensure Pittsburgh is included in the representatives legislation which establishes a State Low Income Housing Tax Credit
- Malady & Wooten is currently working on stopping HB1875 which would shorten the amount of time landlords have to expel a tenant.

Reentry & Workforce Development

- Malady & Wooten successfully helped advance HB163 to the Senate which ends suspension of drivers licenses for non-driving offenses
- Malady & Wooten successfully helped advance the introduction of of HB 1419 and SB529 which provides a "clean slate" for non-violent convictions and non-conviction misdemeanors.

State Funding

- Malady & Wooten advocated in Harrisburg for a Smart City Challenge state grant to match the City's Smart City Challenge award from USDOT. To date \$7 million had been awarded, and an additional \$4 million has been committed.
- Malady & Wooten continues to advocate for PennVEST funding for full lead line replacements and plant infrastructure at PWSA
- Malady & Wooten routinely communicates the City's economic development priorities to DCED and Governor's Office, and members of the General Assembly as directed.

Gaming Local Share (LSA)

- Malady & Wooten successfully lobbied to preserve \$10 million in gaming local share funding
 that the City receives annually. There were initial attempts by suburban legislators to redirect
 this money to the Commonwealth Financing Authority, and a subsequent attempt to sunset
 the allocation annually both of which were beaten back.
- Malady & Wooten successfully lobbied the General Assembly to insert new language into the gaming statute (HB271) which redirected the City's local share funding directly to the City Treasury. This \$10 million in annual LSA funding was previously directed to the ICA.

Municipal Pension Reform

Malady & Wooten has been working with Legislative Leaders and staff to craft municipal
pension reform legislation that would be specific to the City of Pittsburgh as part of a larger
bill that would reform municipal pension plans across the Commonwealth. In addition to
working with the General Assembly, this ongoing effort has and will continue to require
extensive coordination and meetings with the Governor's office, organized labor, the
Greater Pittsburgh Chamber of Commerce and local government associations.

Local Government Preemption

- Malady & Wooten lobbied the Governor's office to veto HB1071, which would have curbed the right of municipalities to regulate use of plastic shopping bags. The Governor vetoed this legislation on June 30, 2017.

Uniform Construction Code

- Malady & Wooten successfully helped advance legislation to update the Uniform
 Construction Code in Pennsylvania. As a result, the code was updated for the first time in 10
 years resulting in increase safety and energy standards as well as ending the potential for
 skyrocketing interest rates.
- Malady & Wooten successfully lobbied to add a seat on the board for Cities of the Second and Third Classes

Public Safety

- Malady & Wooten successfully lobbied for the passage for Body Worn Cameras. The bill
 was passed and signed by the Governor.
- Malady & Wooten is currently lobbying for SB251 (Municipal Radar) to get Cities of the Second Class the right to enforce speeding using radar. The bill passed the Senate in 2017 and passed the House Transportation Committee in May 2018.

Neighborhood Redevelopment

- Malady & Wooten successfully lobbied maintenance of the Neighborhood Assistance Tax Credit and Redevelopment Assistance Capital Programs that faced cuts in 2016-17.
- Malady & Wooten is currently lobbying for an increase to the Neighborhood Assistance Tax Credit program to increase the budgeted allocation from \$18M to \$36M.
