NON-ELECTORAL DEBT THROUGH THE ISSUANCE OF THREE SERIES OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE CITY OF PITTSBURGH, PENNSYLVANIA (THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT") IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED FORTY-ONE MILLION NINE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$241,975,000).FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS TO REFUND CERTAIN OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT'S OUTSTANDING GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, TO FUND THE ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT FACILITIES OR ALTERATIONS, ADDITIONS AND RENOVATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT FACILITIES THROUGHOUT THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT, AND TO PAY THE COST OF ISSUING AND INSURING THE BONDS, OR ANY OR ALL OF THE SAME; STATING THE PURPOSE OF THE REFUNDING; STATING THAT REALISTIC COST ESTIMATES HAVE BEEN MADE FOR THE PROJECT, AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF OTHER CAPITAL PROJECTS UPON APPROPRIATE AMENDMENT HERETO AND STATING THE ESTIMATED PROJECT COMPLETION DATE; STATING THE REALISTIC ESTIMATED USEFUL LIFE OF THE PROJECT FOR WHICH SAID BONDS ARE ISSUED; DESCRIBING CERTAIN PRIOR PROJECTS AND RATIFYING AND CONFIRMING THE ORIGINALLY ESTIMATED REALISTIC USEFUL LIFE THEREOF AND STATING THE REMAINING USEFUL LIFE THEREOF; DIRECTING THE PROPER OFFICERS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT TO PREPARE, CERTIFY AND FILE THE REQUIRED

DEBT STATEMENT AND BORROWING BASE CERTIFICATE; COVENANTING

THAT THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT SHALL INCLUDE THE AMOUNT OF ANNUAL DEBT SERVICE IN ITS BUDGET FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR; PROVIDING FOR FULLY REGISTERED BONDS, DATE OF THE BONDS, INTEREST PAYMENT DATES, PROVISIONS FOR REDEMPTION AND STATED PRINCIPAL MATURITY AMOUNTS AND FIXING THE RATES OF INTEREST ON SUCH BONDS AND PROVIDING FOR BOOK-ENTRY ONLY BONDS: AUTHORIZING THE PROPER OFFICERS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT TO CONTRACT WITH A BANK OR BANK AND TRUST COMPANY FOR ITS SERVICES AS SINKING FUND DEPOSITORY, PAYING AGENT AND REGISTRAR AND STATING A COVENANT AS TO PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST WITHOUT DEDUCTION FOR CERTAIN TAXES; PROVIDING FOR THE REGISTRATION, TRANSFER AND EXCHANGE OF BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE EXECUTION, DELIVERY AND AUTHENTICATION OF BONDS AND THE DISPOSITION OF THE PROCEEDS THEREOF; APPROVING THE FORM OF THE BONDS, PAYING AGENT'S AUTHENTICATION CERTIFICATE AND ASSIGNMENT AND PROVIDING FOR CUSIP NUMBERS TO BE PRINTED ON THE BONDS; PROVIDING FOR TEMPORARY BONDS; AWARDING SUCH BONDS AT NEGOTIATED SALE AND STATING THAT SUCH SALE IS IN THE BEST FINANCIAL INTEREST OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT; CREATING A SINKING FUND AND APPROPRIATING ANNUAL AMOUNTS FOR THE PAYMENT OF DEBT SERVICE ON THE BONDS: AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE PROPER OFFICERS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT TO CERTIFY AND TO FILE WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CERTIFIED COPIES OF THE NECESSARY PROCEEDINGS: COVENANTING THAT THE PROCEEDS OF THE BONDS SHALL NOT BE USED IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO CAUSE CERTAIN SERIES OF BONDS TO BE ARBITRAGE BONDS UNDER FEDERAL TAX LAW PROVISIONS, APPROVING THE CONTENT AND FORM OF A PRELIMINARY OFFICIAL STATEMENT AND AUTHORIZING THE DISTRIBUTION THEREOF AND AUTHORIZING THE PREPARATION, EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN OFFICIAL STATEMENT AND THE UNDERTAKING OF CERTAIN CONTINUING DISCLOSURE; APPROVING THE FORM OF, AND AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF ONE OR MORE ESCROW AGREEMENTS AND OTHERWISE PROVIDING FOR THE REFUNDING OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT'S OUTSTANDING GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, AS DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR MUNICIPAL BOND INSURANCE; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE PROPER OFFICERS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT TO DO ALL THINGS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE RESOLUTION; APPOINTING CERTAIN PROFESSIONS; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE PROPER OFFICERS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT TO PAY ISSUANCE COSTS: REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENT RESOLUTIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS; AND STATING THE EFFECTIVE DATE.
