Addendum:

RFP Waiver Request 2023-2025 Solicitor Contract with the Independent Citizen Police Review Board (CPRB).

The Independent Citizen Police Review Board is empowered to hire a solicitor by the home rule charter (§ 229) and enabled to do so by the City Code (§ 662.03).

Accordingly, since 1997, the Board has sought and received a waiver from the RFP/RFQ process to assure continuity and consistency of their legal representation. It is the Board's decision to preserve and extend their attorney/client relationship with Atty. William F. Ward who is currently with Rothman Gordon PC.

Representation of the "quasi-judicial/quasi-administrative/quasi-criminal" Board requires varied expertise and substantive knowledge of the Board's litigation history. We anticipate potential litigation related to subpoena enforcement.

It is noted that the compensation for this service contract has not changed since 2000: \$40,000 for professional services and \$5,000 for expenses related to the Board's representation.

On July 26, 2022, the Board directed the Executive Director, Elizabeth Pittinger, to pursue a three-year agreement with William F. Ward to continue as the Solicitor of the Independent Citizen Police Review Board commencing January 1, 2023, concluding December 31, 2025.
