- Four new street trees facing Melwood Ave
- Two 'U' style bike racks facing Melwood Ave.
- Three existing concrete stairs to existing entrance doors to the building. The two facing Centre Ave are proposed to be rebuilt in the same configuration as the existing steps.
- One canvas canopy over the doors on the Melwood Ave side of the building.

Plans are uploaded to the application file in Onestop for your reference. Should you or your staff require any additional information, please feel contact my office.

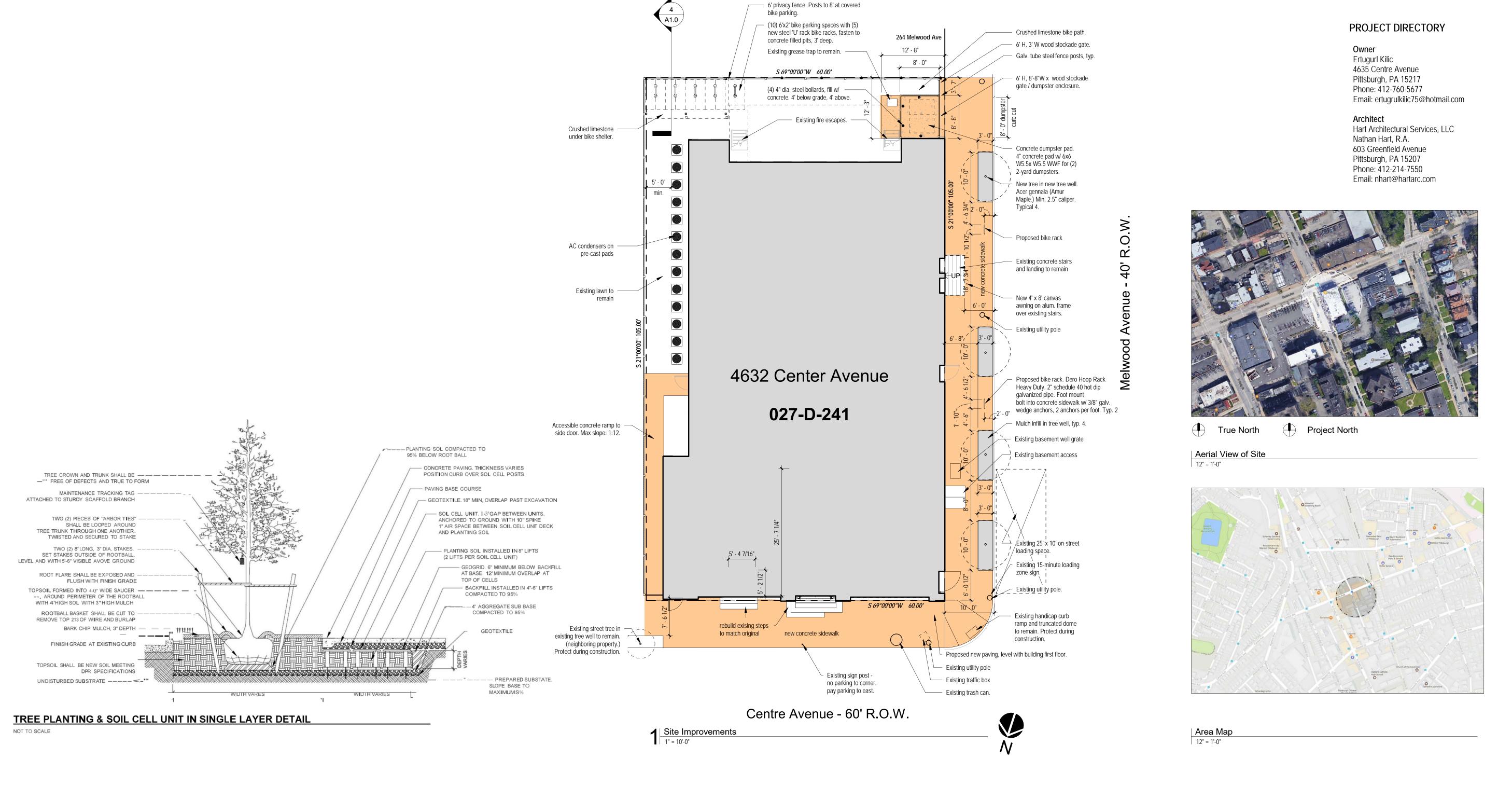

Amy,

Thanks for the quick response. My apologies for not getting back to you sooner. We are absolutely swamped here and aren't taking on new projects until our current projects are further along. We're doing our best to work this re-application into our work load and between other deadlines and client permitting and construction emergencies. Any relief that DOMI can provide in that regard would be greatly appreciated. The owner has received a notice of violation for the work that was started and remains unfinished.

My responses to your comments are as follows:

- 1) The proposed curb cut for the dumpster is to Melwood, not to the adjacent property. For clarity, we have labelled the adjacent property (264 Melwood Ave)
- 2) We will file for an encroachment permit for these existing steps. As the contractor removed them during the course of the sidewalk work, we have noted that they will be rebuilt to match their previous footprint.
- 3) We will file for an encroachment permit for these existing steps and awning.
- 4) These 'U" bike racks were previously reviewed and approved by City Planning.
- 5) We will file for a sidewalk repair permit
- 6) We will file for a curb cut permit to Melwood. There are two types of curb cuts DOMI lists Garage and Parking Pad. This is a dumpster pad. Please advise if we should file for a parking pad curb cut or something else.
- 7) This mechanical equipment will be removed if it hasn't been already.
- 8) These are ground mounted AC units. I have labelled them on the site plan.

I also recovered the site plan we had previously had permitted through Public Works, so I have attached it instead of the site plan we provided previously. I'll also upload it to the Onestop file. If you need any additional information, please let me know.
