We have reviewed the Component 3 Planning Module for the referenced project to be located at 0 Hazelwood Way, Pittsburgh. The project will generate a peak flow of 1100 gpd in the ALCOSAN Monongahela River Interceptor and Woods Run Treatment Plant.

The capacity of the ALCOSAN M-35-00 regulator structure is approximately 3.3 MGD. The estimated peak dry weather flow is approximately 1.70 MGD. Therefore, dry weather capacity exists for this connection. However, the Monongahela River Interceptor and the Woods Run Treatment Plant do not have the capacity for the flows generated during wet weather periods. This limitation will be addressed as ALCOSAN implements its Clean Water Plan.

Section F- Project Narrative

This project will be built at 0 Hazelwood Avenue, 15th Ward of the City Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, PA. The site is bounded on the north by Finn Way, on the south by Hazelwood Avenue, adjacent to the west is a vacant parcel (which is on the corner of Irvine St & Hazelwood Ave), to the east is 131 Hazelwood Avenue, with an existing Warehouse facility owned by United Vending Company.

The existing condition of the site is vacant. The parcel is paved, with rear yard access from Finn Way. Originally purchased by the Hazelwood Bank in 1956, the parcel was sold to the URA of Pittsburgh in 1998. The parcel had originally been two lots, with the current real estate portal records showing that it was consolidated into one parcel. The City of Bridges Community Land Trust is planning to construct a four-unit condo on the parcel.

The scope of work generally consists of constructing a new, 4-unit condominium comprised of two 1-bedroom units, and two 3-bedroom units.

The nature of this proposed development is 'Multi-Residential'.

New Peak Daily Flow is associated with the new construction. Using the *Peak Daily Wastewater Flow Estimates* (Flows are based on PA Code Title 25 Chapter 73 Paragraph 73.17), with the Type of Use (Establishment Type) being One & 3 Bedroom Apartments, the total new peak daily flow will be 1,100 GPD. The number of proposed EDUs is 3.6. The project will make a new tap into the existing 20" VCP combined sewer in Hazelwood Avenue.

The existing, combined 20" VCP (owned by the PWSA), Pipe ID MH056B011.JCT056F006.1. conveys flow southeasterly and enters the ALCOSAN's system at M-35.

Conveyance continues via ALCOSAN's system along the Monongahela River until it crosses the Allegheny River via the structure A-00-JT, located at the Point. From here, flow follows the Allegheny River via ALCOSAN owned infrastructure, until it reaches the discharge point at ALOSAN'S Woods Run WWTP (CDM_1334579). The 3RWW Network Trace Mapping is attached.

We have not participated in any ACT 537 Planning for this parcel.

Section H- Alternative Sewage Facilities Analysis

- The chosen disposal method (also known as the ultimate method, to serve the development for the long term of 5 years or more), of wastewater is to tap into the existing collection system, which is in Hazelwood Avenue, a combined 20" VCP (owned by PWSA) that conveys flow southeasterly and enters the ALCOSAN's system at M-35. The proposed project will add 1,100 GPD (3.6 EDUs) of total new flow. The chosen method has been approved by ALCOSAN, and their Woods Run Wastewater Treatment Plant has an approved NPDES permit in place, supporting the proposed project's compliance in the context of effluent limitations.
- 2. The site is bounded on the north by Finn Way, on the south by Hazelwood Avenue, adjacent to the west is a vacant parcel (which is on the corner of Irvine St & Hazelwood Ave), to the east is 131 Hazelwood Avenue, with an existing Warehouse facility owned by United Vending Company. The project site is in the Local Neighborhood Commercial District, which has a Primary use of Multi-Unit Residential. To the east is R1D-H (single-unit detached residential, high density), and the west is SP-10 (the ALMONO Specially Planned District)... The enclosed 3RWW Sewer Trace mapping illustrates that the surrounding areas are utilizing existing collection systems with similar conveyance methods to ALCOSAN's Woods Run Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- 3. To our knowledge, the proposed project at Site E, 0 Hazelwood Avenue, would not be needing to be combined with any existing collection or proposed disposal projects. The existing condition of the site is a vacant lot.
- 4. Public sewers are the official planned sewage disposal method in the City of Pittsburgh.
- 5. Existing sewage management programs, other than the City of Pittsburgh's Act 537 Plan, may include the PWSA's tap allocation program. The PWSA has authorized the tap allocations associated with the Site E project, and their authorization letter is part of this planning module submission. The discharge does not go to the Chesapeake Bay Watershed.
- 6. There are no alternative sewage disposal methods for this project. It is a highly developed area already served by public sewers.
- 7. The proposed method was chosen because there is an existing collection system in Hazelwood Avenue with the capacity for the added proposed project flow, both now in the short term and in the long term.
- 8. The PWSA owns the collection infrastructure, Pipe ID MH056B011.JCT056F006.1, located in Hazelwood Avenue. From there, flow enters the ALCOSAN System at M-35.
- 9. There are no special considerations that support the choice of disposal method.
