Pittsburgh Community Television 2013 Annual Report

Message from the Executive Director

2013 was another successful year for PCTV. We launched several new programming initiatives, took steps towards improving our facilities, expanded services to youth, and strengthened our financial position. Some highlights of 2013 included the launching of coverage of city league high school sports, expanded summer camp opportunities for youth, and a renewed focus on promoting PCTV in the community. This report is intended as an overview of PCTV's activities in 2013. We hope it will be used as a tool to gauge our effectiveness and as an introduction to PCTV for those who are not familiar with the vital service we provide.

2009 Needs Assessment

In 2009, PCTV conducted a community needs assessment with the assistance of the Buske Group. The key findings of the needs assessment were as follows:

- Current equipment and facility resources are inadequate to meet the needs of the community.
- A greater diversity of local programming is desirable, particularly in the areas of Pittsburgh arts, history and culture, issue oriented programming centered on solutions to local problems, youth produced programs, and community festivals/neighborhood events.
- The community would like PCTV to offer new services such as assistance in producing PSAs, media and public relations training, classes in new media such as video blogging, and coordinated efforts to bring groups together to address key community issues.

PCTV used the results of this needs assessment to guide its activities for 2013. Progress towards addressing these findings is noted throughout this report.

Programming Report

Without question, the most significant and visible service PCTV offers to the city is the community-oriented programming, available 24 hours, 7 days a week on Comcast Channel 21, Verizon Channel 47 and on our website at www.pctv21.org. True to our mission, the majority of the programming we air is local and focused on the City of Pittsburgh.

The programming we offer is Pittsburgh-centered and rooted in community. About half of the programming we aired in 2012 was produced locally by Pittsburgh residents and PCTV staff. We also featured a mix of programs acquired from other sources including the satellite acquired programs Democracy Now, and Grit TV.

PCTV 2013 Programming Overview

- Total hours of first run programming aired: 1,236
- 46.5% or 575 hours of first run programming was produced using PCTV resources.
- 42.1% or 520 hours of first run programming was acquired by satellite from Free Speech Television.
- 4.3% or 53 hours of first run programming was acquired from other sources to meet outreach needs.
- 1% or 10 hours of first run programming was pre-produced programming from non-profit organizations.
- 6.1% or 76 hours of first run programming was programming produced locally without PCTV equipment.

Block Programming

In 2013, PCTV continued to utilize a block programming format to schedule programs on the channel. This approach continues to ensure that no one type of programming dominates. It also encourages the production of a greater diversity of programming. Our block programming categories in 2013 were Health and Lifestyle, Community, Music and Entertainment, Sports and Recreation, News/Issues/Public Affairs, Arts/Film/Culture, Religious/Spiritual, Youth, and General Interest/Talk Show.

Programming Initiatives

In order to provide a balanced mix of shows for our community of viewers, PCTV actively seeks out opportunities to create and acquire new programming. Some highlights of our 2013 programming related initiatives included:

- Continued coverage of Pittsburgh Public Schools board meetings. PCTV staff records the meetings and delivers them for air on PCTV and the City Channel.
- Coverage of the Boys and Girls City League High School Basketball Championships and the Girls City League High School Volleyball Championships.
- Coverage of a 2013 mayoral candidate forum at Obama Academy.
- Coverage of a school board candidate forum sponsored by A+ Schools.
- Continued collaboration with SLB Radio to carry the Saturday Light Brigade program every Saturday morning.
- Production of a video portrait of city council district 8 as part of a series called "90 Neighborhoods in 90 Days".
- Continued production of "It Happened Here", a series about events and activities in Pittsburgh.

Public Access Services

In 2013, PCTV continued to offer a range of services designed to ensure equal access to our resources for the production and distribution of community-oriented programming.

Training

In 2013, we continued to offer a range of trainings designed to teach users of all experience levels the basics of television production. Our offerings included:

- Orientation, an overview of how to get involved at PCTV. The class is available in person or on-line.
- Producer Prep, a preparatory class for those who want to become community producers.
- Studio Production for volunteers, a one day class focused on teaching volunteer camera operators and lighting assistants.
- Electronic Field Production, an introduction to the art of shooting on-location video with our Panasonic HMC 80 cameras.
- Intro to Final Cut Pro X, an introduction to digital non-linear editing on Apple iMac computers.

We also hosted a series of quarterly networking nights for community producers to learn from one another and to spur potential collaborations.

For the third year in a row, we also offered a television production summer camp for teenagers. In 2013 we offered three weeks of camp, one for the general public, one for the Manchester Youth Development Center, and one for the Stem Girlz program coordinated by the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh. All three weeks culminated in a group effort to produce a television program for air on PCTV.

In 2013, PCTV:

- Offered a total of 52 classes to a total of 366 class registrants.
- Issued 205 training certifications.

Facilities and Equipment

As part of our commitment to serving the community, PCTV provides the means of production and distribution for local residents and non-profits. PCTV operates a facility on Pittsburgh's North Side that includes a three camera production studio with storage for sets and props, several editing computers for community use, and a dub suite for transferring video between formats. PCTV also provides a range of field production

equipment for community use including camcorders, tripods and microphones. In addition, PCTV operates and maintains all the equipment necessary to broadcast programming on its cable channel and website. A full inventory of currently available equipment is attached as an addendum to this report.

Due to the uncertainty regarding our contract renewal, PCTV did not make any major equipment purchases 2013. We did, however, purchase 4 Macbook Pro laptops for youth media use. These laptops were utilized for the offsite summer camp we did for the Stem Girlz program coordinated by the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh.

The renovation we hoped to begin in 2013 was also delayed due to the contract situation. Instead, it will be completed in 2014.

What follows is an overview of equipment and facility usage at PCTV in 2013:

Outreach and Promotional Activities

In 2013, PCTV made a concerted effort to increase promotional efforts to attract new participants. A summary of our activities includes:

- Active participation as a member of the North Side/Northshore Chamber of Commerce.
- Active participation with the Community Bridge Builders Network.
- Continued running spots promoting PCTV on Comcast channels in Pittsburgh.
- Ran ad campaigns promoting PCTV in the City Paper, Soul Pitt Magazine, and the Northside Chronicle.
- Attended the 2013 Alliance for Community Media Conference in San Francisco.

Financial Resources

In 2013, we continued to put major focus on financial accountability and generation of new revenue. PCTV's 2013 Audited Financial Statements are included with this report. Some highlights of PCTV financial performance for 2013 include:

- Attracting \$54,829 in Special Project Income, our highest total ever.
- Continued success in attracting business underwriters, resulting in \$750 in

income.

- Over \$3,400 in individual contributions through the Day of Giving and individual donor campaigns.
- Over \$20,000 in combined income from production services and enrollment fees.
- \$82,989 in non-franchise income. This equates to 16.3% of our income coming from non-franchise sources.

Board of Directors List

At the end of 2013, PCTV had six board members. Board Chair James Abraham is an attorney with a practice in Pittsburgh. He formerly served as board chair at WQED and is very active in Pittsburgh's non-profit community. Vice-President Peter Konczakowski is Branch Manager of First National Bank and is active in the North Side business community. Secretary Kate Bayer is a retired marketing, communications and fundraising professional. She is active in the Lawrenceville community. Michael Freker is a Retirement Planning Specialist for AXA Advisor who is active in the Downtown business community. Shirley Douglas is a community producer at PCTV. INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors Pittsburgh Community Television Corporation Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Pittsburgh Community Television (not-for-profit organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2013, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the organization's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate to the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the organization's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluation the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Pittsburgh Community Television (not-for-profit organization) as of December 31, 2013, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with auditing principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Report on Summarized Comparative Information

We have previously audited Pittsburgh Community Television (not-for-profit organization)'s 2012 financial statements, and we expressed an unmodified audit opinion on those audited financial statements in our report dated April 22, 2013. In our opinion, the summarized comparative information presented herein and of and for the year ended December 31, 2012 is consistent, in all material respects, with the audited financial statements from which it has been derived.

Pittsburgh Community Television Corporation Notes to the Financial Statements Year Ended – December 31, 2013

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

Pittsburgh Community Television Corporation (PCTV) is a non-profit corporation whose objective is to serve the people of Pittsburgh by providing public access on an equal opportunity basis to city residents. It provides training, equipment, and production services to the community for cable access, and actively advocates for Public Access and First Amendment rights. PCTV strives to be a telecommunication resource that is educational and accessible for community producers, engaging, and diverse for viewers, and provides alternatives for the community.

PCTV was incorporated as a Pennsylvania non-profit corporation, June 27, 1985, and in December 1985 received IRC §501(c)(3) designation. Consequently, contributions to PCTV are tax deductible within limitations prescribed by the Internal Revenue Code.

The office of PCTV is located at 1300 Western Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15233. The telephone number is (412) 322-7570. The website is www.pctv21.org.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

PCTV uses the accrual basis of accounting. Under this method, revenues are recorded when earned and expenses recorded when incurred without regard to the time of cash receipt or disbursement. Net assets and revenues, expenses, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

B. Financial Statement Presentation

PCTV reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets and temporarily restricted net assets summarized as follows:

<u>Unrestricted:</u> Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations. PCTV has discretionary control.

<u>Temporarily Restricted:</u> Net assets that are subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may or will be met, either by actions of PCTV and/or the passage of time. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. As of December 31, 2013, PCTV's temporarily restricted net assets were \$502,754.

C. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Significant estimates used in preparing these financial statements include the fair market value of investments, depreciation of property and equipment, and the allocation of expenses. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

PCTV considers all highly liquid deposits available for current use with an initial maturity of ninety days or less to be cash equivalents.

E. Investments

Purchased marketable securities are carried at fair value. Donated marketable securities are recorded at fair value on the date of donation and carried at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Gains and investment income are recognized in the period earned and are classified as unrestricted or temporarily restricted with respect to the stipulations established by the donor at the date of donation or applicable state law.

F. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment acquired with a basis of \$500 or greater are recorded at cost when purchased. Expenditures for renewals and improvements that significantly extend the useful life of an asset are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are expensed. Gains and losses on disposition of property and equipment are reflected in income. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

Depreciation expense amounted to \$30,395 for the year ended December 31, 2013.

G. Impairment of Long-Lived Assets

Long-lived assets are reviewed for impairment when circumstances indicate the carrying value of an asset may not be recovered. For assets that are to be held and used, impairment is recognized when the estimated undiscounted cash flows associated with the asset or group of assets is less than their carrying value. If impairment exists, an adjustment is made to write the asset down to its fair value, and a loss is recorded as the difference between the carrying value and fair value. Fair values are determined based on quoted market values, discounted cash flows, or internal and external appraisals, as applicable. Assets to be disposed of are carried at the lower of carrying value or estimated net realizable value.

H. Support and Revenue Recognition

Support including unconditional promises to give, are recognized as revenues in the period received. Contributions subject to donor-imposed stipulations that are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support. Promises to give that are scheduled to be received after the financial position date are shown as increases in temporarily restricted net assets and are reclassified to unrestricted net assets when the purpose or time restriction is met. Conditional promises to give are not recognized until they become unconditional; that is, when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. Contributions of assets other than cash are recorded at their estimated fair value. Contributions to be received after one year, if any, are discounted at the appropriate rate commensurate with risks involved.

I. Donated Services and Materials

When services are donated to PCTV by interested parties in course of carrying out its mission, in general, no amounts are reflected in the financial statements for those services since generally there is no objective basis to measure the value of such services. In limited circumstances, however, objectively measurable donated services are recorded. These donated services must require specialized skills, be provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically be purchased if not provided by donation. PCTV received \$0 in donated services during the year under audit.

Donated materials are recorded at their fair value at the date of the donation.

These donations are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets unless the donor has restricted the donated asset to a specific purpose.

J. Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined that PCTV is exempt from federal income taxes under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and files an IRS Form 990. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is recorded in the accompanying financial statements.

As a tax-exempt organization, no part of PCTV's net assets can inure to the benefit of any private individual. In the event PCTV is dissolved and liquidated, the net assets, after paying all liabilities, would be distributed to a similar tax-exempt organization, which in the judgment of the Board of Directors, has a purpose clearly allied to that of PCTV's.

PCTV accounts for uncertainty in income taxes using a recognition threshold of more-likely-thannot to be sustained upon examination by the appropriate taxing authority. Measurement of the tax uncertainty occurs if the recognition threshold is met. Management determined that there were no tax uncertainties that met the recognition threshold in fiscal year 2013. PCTV's IRS Forms 990 are subject to review for three years subsequent to the date filed.

K. Fair Value Measurement

A fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation methods is used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that PCTV has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Quoted prices in markets that are not active, or inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement (i.e. supported with little or no market activity).

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

PCTV, using available market information and appropriate valuation methodologies, has determined the estimated fair value of any financial instruments. However, considerable judgment is required in interpreting data to develop the estimates of fair value. The fair values of any PCTV's financial instruments are estimated based on current market rates and instruments with the same risk and maturities.

L. Advertising

PCTV uses advertising to promote its programs and services. Advertising and promotional costs are expensed as incurred. For the year ended December 31, 2013 advertising expense was \$9,104.

M. Subsequent Events

PCTV has evaluated all events through March 26, 2014 which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that there are no subsequent events that require recognition or disclosure.

N. FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES

The costs of providing the various programs and other services of the Organization have been summarized on a functional basis in the Statement of Activities. Program and support services are detailed on the Schedule of Functional Expenses. Two methods of expense allocation have been used. Each line on the statement of functional expenses has been labeled with the allocation method used.

- Overall Based upon estimated time expended by staff.
- Actual The line item could be specifically identified with a function.

NOTE 3: FUNCTIONAL CATEGORIES

A. PROGRAM SERVICES

- 1. **Production** Expenses related to PCTV's production of television programs that are targeted towards community need.
- Programming Expenses related to scheduling the programs submitted for airing on PCTV's television channel.
- Outreach Expenses related to outreach into the community to underserved groups, including youth.
- Public Access Expenses related to assisting community producers and non-profit
 organizations in the production of television programming.

B. SUPPORT SERVICES

- 1. Management and General These are costs not identified with a single function, but are indispensable to the operation of the Organization.
- 2. Fund Raising This includes the cost specifically related to raising moneys for PCTV.

NOTE 4: RETIREMENT PLAN

The Organization makes available a Simple IRA retirement account for full-time regular employees. The Organization contributed \$5,820 to this plan, which matches employee contributions to a maximum of 3% of the qualifying salary. Consistent with the plan rules, employees may elect to have amounts contributed to the fund on a tax deferred salary reduction basis, as specified within IRS guidelines.

NOTE 5: COPIER LOAN

In May of 2013 PCTV financed the pay-out of a copier lease so that a replacement could be acquired. The amount of the pay-out was \$7,771. Payments are noninterest bearing and require a \$432 monthly payment. The term is eighteen months. \$3,453 has been paid at year end. The remainder of the pay-out, \$4,318, will be paid in the subsequent year.

NOTE 6: PUBLIC, EDUCATIONAL AND GOVERNMENT (PEG) CHANNEL ADMINISTRATOR

On November 1, 2013, PCTV was contracted by the City of Pittsburgh as the PEG Channel Administrator. The City agrees to provide funds to PCTV in the amounts and in the manner set forth in §12.1 of the agreement and assign control and management of certain access facilities and resources. At year end, the "Annual PEG Grants" provided a remittance of \$321,523. Also at year end, the "Fixed PEG Grants" provides a remittance of \$105,000 for utilization of state-of the-art video and audio production equipment consistent with PCTV's available funding and regular maintenance and repair of such pursuant to §5.6 and §5.7 of the agreement. Pursuant to the agreement, the City will remit the specified amount (in 2013 it was \$305,000) on December 18th of each year for which the agreement is in effect. At year end the City has remitted \$-0-.

Pittsburgh Community Television Report on New and Enhanced Revenue Sources 2013

Overview

Due to the changing economic reality that PCTV faces, generating new and enhanced revenue sources continued to be a high priority for PCTV in 2013. We are happy to report that in 2013 we maintained our progress towards generating other non-franchise sources of revenue. We generated \$82,989 in non-franchise income in 2013. The sources of income we are reporting on in this report include:

- 1) 4020 Foundation Grants-- grant income received from foundation services.
- 2) **4030 Special Project Income** income derived from PCTV hiring out its television production services.
- 3) **4035 Producer Enrollment Fees** enrollment fees from Pittsburgh residents and non-profits who are community producers at PCTV. Includes yearly enrollment, six-month enrollment and class fees.
- 4) **4040 Production Services** income derived from additional services including DVD and tape duplication and rental of duplication equipment
- 5) **4045 Fundraisers/Special Events**—income from any event fundraisers PCTV participates in.
- 6) 4050 Donations—donations from individual donors.
- 7) **4055 Underwriting/Sponsorship Income** contributions from businesses and non-profits in exchange for recognition as an underwriter or sponsor on PCTV.
- 8) 4065 Rental Income income from rental of PCTV facilities or equipment.
- 9) **4070 Miscellaneous Income** miscellaneous income that does not easily fit into another category.
- 10) **4105 Sales Vending Machines** sales of food and drink items from PCTV's vending machine.
- 11) **4110 Sales Tape and Merchandise** income from sales of blank DVD and tape stock and other merchandise such as t-shirts.
- 12) 4900 Interest Income—income from interest bearing bank accounts.

Income Generation Activities in 2013

PCTV worked diligently in 2013 to increase income in all categories. Our specific efforts included the following:

- Participation in the October 3rd Day of Giving with the Pittsburgh Foundation.
 The 2013 event generated \$900 for PCTV.
- Continued efforts to increase 4030 Special Project Income. In 2013 we generated \$54,829 in income from special projects, our most ever.
- Increases in 4035 Producer Enrollment and 4040 Production Services.

- Continued focus on attracting individual donations in line 4050 Donations through participation in the Day of Giving and an annual campaign. We brought it over \$3,400 in this category in 2013.
- The continuation of our underwriting program. This brought in \$750 in 2013.
