Pittsburgh Community Television 2014 Annual Report

Message from the Executive Director

PCTV is a unique non-profit organization that provides a service that no other entity in Pittsburgh can match-- access to city-wide television and media on an equal opportunity basis regardless of viewpoint. In our media saturated age PCTV provides a vital service to the City of Pittsburgh and its residents, the ability to be heard. In 2014 we continued that tradition of service, resulting in hundreds of hours of community produced television programming, opportunities for youth, and unique media content not available in the mainstream media. In addition to being an overview of our accomplishments in 2014, we hope that those who are not familiar with PCTV will find this report a useful introduction to all things PCTV. We look forward to serving the community for many years to come.

Programming Report

PCTV distributes its programming 24 hours a day, 7 days a week on Comcast Channel 21, and Verizon Channel 47 in the City of Pittsburgh. An identical web stream is also available on the organization website at www.pctv21.org along with a selection of ondemand programs. In addition, a sampling of some of our programs is available on PCTV's YouTube channel.

Due to the local nature of our channels, we are Pittsburgh-centric in our programming choices. The majority of the programming we air is produced by city residents using technical resources (facilities, equipment, staff) provided by PCTV. We supplement that output by filling out the schedule with programs produced by PCTV's professional staff, satellite programming from Free Speech Television, and pre-produced programming gathered from other sources. Whether it is produced locally or not, all of our programming is selected to be reflective of the diverse interests of Pittsburgh viewers.

PCTV 2014 Programming Overview

- Total hours of first run programming aired: 1,348
- 48% or 643 hours of first run programming was produced using PCTV resources.
- 38% or 518 hours of first run programming was acquired by satellite from Free Speech Television.
- 14% or 187 hours of first run programming was acquired from other sources to meet outreach needs.
- Of the 187 hours acquired from other sources 79% or 149 hours was pre-produced programming from non-profit organizations and 93% or 173 hours was produced locally without PCTV equipment.

Block Programming

In 2010 we shifted our programming schedule to a block programming scheme that allows for scheduling based on subject matter. This provides a mechanism for ensuring that we feature a wide variety of programming. It also makes it easier for viewers to find the kinds of programs they want to watch. Our block programming categories in 2014 were Health and Lifestyle, Community, Music and Entertainment, Sports and Recreation, News/Issues/Public Affairs, Arts/Film/Culture, Religious/Spiritual, Youth, and General Interest/Talk Show.

Programming Initiatives

To encourage a balanced programming schedule PCTV undertook a number of initiatives in 2014 that resulted in new programming. Those efforts included the following:

- Continued coverage of Pittsburgh Public Schools board meetings. PCTV staff records the meetings and delivers them for air on PCTV and the City Channel.
- Coverage of the Boys City League High School Basketball Championships and the Girls City League High School Volleyball Championships, and City League High School Football Championships.
- Produced "Fair Housing: Your Rights" In Action in collaboration with the City of Pittsburgh Commission on Human Relations.
- Produced and aired three PSAs for the Commission on Human Relations. Topics included disability rights, racial discrimination, and rights for same sex partners.
- Created a new periodic program focused on the Pittsburgh art scene called "Conversation with the Artist".
- Began a new series about independent filmmaking called "Indie Film Forum".
- Covered a discussion about education with A+ Schools.
- Produced an interview program featuring Mark Musolino, founder of Revv Oakland.
- Aired "Land Bank 412", a youth documentary produced by the URA of Pittsburgh Urban Matters Program.
- Covered the Greater Pittsburgh Arts Council "Doggy Fashion Show".
- Aired the Steeltown Entertainment "Take a Shot" Contest entries.
- Continued airing of "Road to Recovery", a health program for those recovering from drug and alcohol addiction.
- Produced a new series called UFOs Over Pittsburgh, a look at local evidence of UFO activity.
- Continued collaboration with SLB Radio to carry the Saturday Light Brigade program every Saturday morning.

Public Access Services

In 2014, PCTV continued to offer a range of services designed to ensure equal access to our resources for the production and distribution of community-oriented programming.

Training

In 2014, we offered a range of trainings designed to teach users of all experience levels the basics of television production. Our offerings included:

- Orientation, an overview of how to get involved at PCTV. The class is available in person or on-line.
- Producer Prep, a preparatory class for those who want to become community producers.
- Electronic Field Production, an introduction to the art of shooting on-location video with our Panasonic HMC 80 cameras.
- Intro to Final Cut Pro X, an introduction to digital non-linear editing on Apple iMac computers.

We also hosted a series of quarterly networking nights for community producers to learn from one another and to spur potential collaborations.

For the third year in a row, we also offered a television production summer camp for teenagers. In 2014 we offered our camp in conjunction with the URA of Pittsburgh Urban Matters program. Students learned how to operate studio equipment, field cameras, and editing equipment.

In 2014, PCTV:

- Offered a total of 48 classes to a total of 195 class registrants.
- Issued 82 training certifications.

Facilities and Equipment

As part of our commitment to serving the community, PCTV provides the means of production and distribution for local residents and non-profits. PCTV operates a facility on Pittsburgh's North Side that includes a three camera production studio with storage for sets and props, several editing computers for community use, and a dub suite for transferring video between formats. PCTV also provides a range of field production equipment for community use including camcorders, tripods and microphones. In addition, PCTV operates and maintains all the equipment necessary to broadcast programming on its cable channel and website. A full inventory of currently available equipment is attached as an addendum to this report.

This year PCTV resumed planned improvements to equipment and facilities after the signing of a new contract with the City of Pittsburgh. In October 2014 we purchased new studio cameras. After several years of planning we finally began our facility renovation project in December. It is scheduled to be completed in mid-June 2015.

What follows is an overview of equipment and facility usage at PCTV in 2014:

Outreach and Promotional Activities

In 2014, PCTV continued to take steps to promote the organization in the wider community. A summary of our activities includes:

- Active participation as a member of the North Side/Northshore Chamber of Commerce.
- Active participation with the Community Bridge Builders Network.
- Continued running spots promoting PCTV on Comcast channels in Pittsburgh.
- Ran ads promoting PCTV in the City Paper, Soul Pitt Magazine, and the Northside Chronicle.

Financial Resources

In 2014, we continued our efforts to generate new sources of revenue while making financial accountability one of our highest priorities. PCTV's 2014 Audited Financial Statements are included with this report. Some highlights of PCTV financial performance for 2014 include:

- Attracting \$54,700 in Special Project Income, which represent amounts earned for production for hire.
- \$1,000 in underwriting income from local businesses supporting PCTV in exchange for a non-commercial acknowledgement.
- \$76,726 in donations, including a \$75,000 donation from our landlord toward renovations costs.
- Over \$21,000 in fees from community members who use PCTV.
- \$154,351 in non-franchise income. This equates to 25% of our income coming from non-franchise sources.

Board of Directors List

PCTV currently has 7 board members. Board Chair James Abraham is an attorney with a practice in Pittsburgh. He formerly served as board chair at WQED and is very active in Pittsburgh's non-profit community. Vice-President Peter Konczakowski is Branch Manager of First National Bank and is active in the North Side business community. Secretary Kate Bayer is a retired marketing, communications and fundraising professional. She is active in the Lawrenceville community. Juan Garrett is the Executive Director of the Riverside Center for Innovation. Michael Freker is a Retirement Planning Specialist for AXA Advisor who is active in the Downtown business community. Steven Townsend is an attorney at Eddy, DeLuca, Gravina and Towsend. Luther Dupree is a community producer at PCTV. He is a Supervisor at Mon Yough Community Services. Pittsburgh Community Television Report on New and Enhanced Revenue Sources 2014

Overview

Over the last six years, PCTV has diligently pursued the generation of revenue above and beyond that provided by the cable franchise agreements with Comcast and Verizon. We've been consistently successful at attracting other sources of revenue and our results in 2014 clearly demonstrate this. We generated \$154,351 in non-franchise revenue in 2014. The sources of revenue we are reporting on in this report include:

- 1) 4020 Foundation Grants-- grant income received from foundation services.
- 2) **4030 Special Project Income** income derived from PCTV hiring out its television production services.
- 3) **4035 Producer Enrollment Fees** enrollment fees from Pittsburgh residents and non-profits who are community producers at PCTV. Includes yearly enrollment, six-month enrollment and class fees.
- 4) **4040 Production Services** income derived from additional services including DVD and tape duplication and rental of duplication equipment
- 4045 Fundraisers/Special Events—income from any event fundraisers PCTV participates in.
- 6) 4050 Donations—donations from individual donors.
- 7) **4055 Underwriting/Sponsorship Income** contributions from businesses and non-profits in exchange for recognition as an underwriter or sponsor on PCTV.
- 8) 4065 Rental Income income from rental of PCTV facilities or equipment.
- 9) **4070 Miscellaneous Income** miscellaneous income that does not easily fit into another category.
- 10) **4105 Sales Vending Machines** sales of food and drink items from PCTV's vending machine.
- 11) **4110 Sales Tape and Merchandise** income from sales of blank DVD and tape stock and other merchandise such as t-shirts.
- 12) 4900 Interest Income—income from interest bearing bank accounts.

Income Generation Activities in 2014

The highlights of our revenue generation efforts in 2014 include the following:

- Participation in the May 6th Day of Giving with the Pittsburgh Foundation and the October 2nd Arts Day of Giving with the Greater Pittsburgh Arts Council. The combined events generated \$1,189 for PCTV.
- Sustained results in 4030 Special Project Income. In 2014 we generated \$54,700 in income from special projects, which represent fees paid to PCTV for video production services.

- A combined increase in 4035 Producer Enrollment and 4040 Production Services over 2013. The combined total was \$21,406.
- A record donation total of \$76,726. This includes a \$75,000 contribution from our landlord towards renovation costs.
- Continued success with our underwriting program. This brought in \$1,000 in 2014.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Pittsburgh Community Television (not-for-profit organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2014, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

Pittsburgh Community Television Corporation (PCTV) is a not-for-profit corporation whose objective is to serve the people of Pittsburgh by providing public access on an equal opportunity basis to city residents. It provides training, equipment, and production services to the community for cable access, and actively advocates for Public Access and First Amendment rights. PCTV strives to be a telecommunication resource that is educational and accessible for community producers, engaging, and diverse for viewers, and provides alternatives for the community.

PCTV was incorporated as a Pennsylvania non-profit corporation, June 27, 1985, and in December 1985 received IRC §501(c)(3) designation. Consequently, contributions to PCTV are tax deductible within limitations prescribed by the Internal Revenue Code.

The office of PCTV is located at 1300 Western Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15233. The telephone number is (412) 322-7570. The website is www.pctv21.org.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

PCTV uses the accrual basis of accounting. Under this method, revenues are recorded when earned and expenses recorded when incurred without regard to the time of cash receipt or disbursement. Net assets and revenues, expenses, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

B. Financial Statement Presentation

PCTV reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets and temporarily restricted net assets summarized as follows:

<u>Unrestricted:</u> Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations. PCTV has discretionary control.

<u>Temporarily Restricted</u>: Net assets that are subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may or will be met, either by actions of PCTV and/or the passage of time. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. As of December 31, 2014, PCTV's temporarily restricted net assets were \$498,757.

C. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Significant estimates used in preparing these financial statements include the fair market value of investments, depreciation of property and equipment, and the allocation of expenses. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

PCTV considers all highly liquid deposits available for current use with an initial maturity of ninety days or less to be cash equivalents.

E. Investments

Purchased marketable securities are carried at fair value. Donated marketable securities are recorded at fair value on the date of donation and carried at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Gains and investment income are recognized in the period earned and are classified as unrestricted or temporarily restricted with respect to the stipulations established by the donor at the date of donation or applicable state law.

F. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment acquired with a basis of \$500 or greater are recorded at cost when purchased. Expenditures for renewals and improvements that significantly extend the useful life of an asset are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are expensed. Gains and losses on disposition of property and equipment are reflected in income. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

Depreciation expense amounted to \$33,114 for the year ended December 31, 2014.

G. Impairment of Long-Lived Assets

Long-lived assets are reviewed for impairment when circumstances indicate the carrying value of an asset may not be recovered. For assets that are to be held and used, impairment is recognized when the estimated undiscounted cash flows associated with the asset or group of assets is less than their carrying value. If impairment exists, an adjustment is made to write the asset down to its fair value, and a loss is recorded as the difference between the carrying value and fair value. Fair values are determined based on quoted market values, discounted cash flows, or internal and external appraisals, as applicable. Assets to be disposed of are carried at the lower of carrying value or estimated net realizable value.

H. Support and Revenue Recognition

Support including unconditional promises to give, are recognized as revenues in the period received. Contributions subject to donor-imposed stipulations that are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support. Promises to give that are scheduled to be received after the financial position date are shown as increases in temporarily restricted net assets and are reclassified to unrestricted net assets when the purpose or time restriction is met. Conditional promises to give are not recognized until they become unconditional; that is, when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. Contributions of assets other than cash are recorded at their estimated fair value. Contributions to be received after one year, if any, are discounted at the appropriate rate commensurate with risks involved.

I. Donated Services and Materials

When services are donated to PCTV by interested parties in course of carrying out its mission, in general, no amounts are reflected in the financial statements for those services since generally there is no objective basis to measure the value of such services. In limited circumstances, however, objectively measurable donated services are recorded. These donated services must require specialized skills, be provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically be purchased if not provided by donation. PCTV received \$0 in donated services during the year under audit.

Donated materials are recorded at their fair value at the date of the donation.

These donations are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets unless the donor has restricted the donated asset to a specific purpose.

J. Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined that PCTV is exempt from federal income taxes under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and files an IRS Form 990. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is recorded in the accompanying financial statements,

As a tax-exempt organization, no part of PCTV's net assets can inure to the benefit of any private individual. In the event PCTV is dissolved and liquidated, the net assets, after paying all liabilities, would be distributed to a similar tax-exempt organization, which in the judgment of the Board of Directors, has a purpose clearly allied to that of PCTV's.

PCTV accounts for uncertainty in income taxes using a recognition threshold of more-likely-thannot to be sustained upon examination by the appropriate taxing authority. Measurement of the tax uncertainty occurs if the recognition threshold is met. Management determined that there were no tax uncertainties that met the recognition threshold in fiscal year 2014. PCTV's IRS Form 990 are subject to review for three years subsequent to the date filed.

K. Fair Value Measurement

A fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation methods is used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that PCTV has the ability to access.
- Level 2 -Quoted prices in markets that are not active, or inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement (i.e. supported with little or no market activity).

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

PCTV, using available market information and appropriate valuation methodologies, has determined the estimated fair value of any financial instruments. However, considerable judgment is required in interpreting data to develop the estimates of fair value. The fair values of any PCTV's financial instruments are estimated based on current market rates and instruments with the same risk and maturities.

L. Advertising

PCTV uses advertising to promote its programs and services. Advertising and promotional costs are expensed as incurred. For the year ended December 31, 2014 advertising expense was \$2,765.

M. Subsequent Events

PCTV has evaluated all events through April 3, 2015 which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that there are no subsequent events that require recognition or disclosure.

N. FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES

The costs of providing the various programs and other services of the Organization have been summarized on a functional basis in the Statement of Activities. Program and support services are detailed on the Schedule of Functional Expenses. Two methods of expense allocation have been used. Each line on the statement of functional expenses has been labeled with the allocation method used.

- 1. Overall Based upon estimated time expended by staff.
- 2. Actual The line item could be specifically identified with a function.

NOTE 3: FUNCTIONAL CATEGORIES

A. PROGRAM SERVICES

- 1. **Production** Expenses related to PCTV's production of television programs that are targeted towards community need.
- Programming Expenses related to scheduling the programs submitted for airing on PCTV's television channel.
- Outreach Expenses related to outreach into the community to underserved groups, including youth.
- 4. **Public Access** Expenses related to assisting community producers and non-profit organizations in the production of television programming.

B. SUPPORT SERVICES

- Management and General These are costs not identified with a single function, but are indispensable to the operation of the Organization.
- 2. Fund Raising This includes the cost specifically related to raising moneys for PCTV.

NOTE 4: RETIREMENT PLAN

The Organization makes available a Simple IRA retirement account for full-time regular employees. The Organization contributed \$5,888 to this plan, which matches employee contributions to a maximum of 3% of the qualifying salary. Consistent with the plan rules, employees may elect to have amounts contributed to the fund on a tax deferred salary reduction basis, as specified within IRS guidelines.

NOTE 5: LINES OF CREDIT

The Organization maintains a line of credit from a financial institution with a \$75,000 limit. At year-end the interest rate was 5.250% per annum. At year-end there was no outstanding balance.

NOTE 6: LOANS

The Organization arranged a development fund loan with a \$75,000 limit and an interest rate of 7.00% per annum. At year-end the outstanding balance was \$75,000. The loan requires 84 monthly payments beginning January 1, 2015. The loan requires collateralization in the form of a \$50,000 certificate of deposit held by a local bank. The required principal & interest payments are as follows:

The organization also arranged a bank loan with a \$250,600 limit and an interest rate of 3,990% per annum. At year-end the outstanding balance was \$350. The loan requires collateralization in the form of business assets i.e. a \$100,000 certificate of deposit held by the granting bank.

NOTE 7: PUBLIC, EDUCATIONAL AND GOVERNMENT (PEG) CHANNEL ADMINISTRATOR

On November 1, 2013, PCTV was contracted by the City of Pittsburgh as the PEG Channel Administrator. The City agrees to provide funds to PCTV in the amounts and in the manner set forth in §12.1 of the agreement and assign control and management of certain access facilities and resources. At year-end, the "Annual PEG Grants" provided a remittance of \$417,964. Also at year end, the "Fixed PEG Grants" provides a remittance of \$35,000 for utilization of state-of the-art video and audio production equipment consistent with PCTV's available funding and regular maintenance and repair of such pursuant to §5.6 and §5.7 of the agreement. Pursuant to the agreement, the City will remit the specified amount (in 2014 it was \$35,000) on December 18th of each year for which the agreement is in effect. At year end the City has remitted \$35,000.
