

Pittsburgh Community Television 2016 Annual Report

Message from the Executive Director

2016 was another great year for PCTV as we took advantage of the facility renovation project completed in 2015. In 2016 PCTV:

- Served 122 community producers who produced programming at PCTV.
- Aired over 1,100 hours of new first run programming.
- Produced 19 programs that highlighted Pittsburgh-area nonprofits.
- Promoted PCTV at 18 community festivals.
- Produced live coverage of the Deutschtown Music Festival.
- Held our fifth annual youth summer camp.
- Opened up participation to Allegheny County residents.
- Installed new signage on the exterior of the building.

This annual report is an overview of our accomplishments and achievements for the year 2016. We hope it serves as an informative picture of PCTV and its activities for old and new friends alike.

Programming Report

PCTV distributes its programming 24 hours a day, 7 days a week on four distribution outlets including Comcast Channel 21 and Verizon Channel 47 in the City of Pittsburgh, on PCTV's website at www.pctv21.org, and on PCTV's YouTube Channel at www.youtube.com/pctv21.

PCTV is truly a Pittsburgh channel, with the majority of the programming being produced and contributed by city residents. Residents can utilize PCTV's technical resources (facilities, equipment, staff) to produce programming or they can produce it on their own and submit it for air. Additional programming is produced by PCTV (see list under programming initiatives), acquired by satellite from Free Speech Television, or acquired from various other sources. Regardless of the source, all programming is chosen based on its relevance to our Pittsburgh audience.

PCTV 2016 Programming Overview

- Total hours of first run programming aired: 1,135
- 38% or 427 hours of first run programming was produced using PCTV resources.
- 45% or 514 hours of first run programming was acquired by satellite from Free Speech Television.

- 17% or 194 hours of first run programming was acquired from other sources to meet outreach needs.
- Of the 194 hours acquired from other sources 91% or 176 hours was pre-produced programming from non-profit organizations that was produced locally without PCTV equipment.

Block Programming

In 2016 we continued to use the block programming format that we began in 2010. To ensure a diversity of types of programming, we schedule programs using the following categories: Health and Lifestyle, Community, Music and Entertainment, Sports and Recreation, News/Issues/Public Affairs, Arts/Film/Culture, Religious/Spiritual, Youth, and General Interest/Talk Show.

Programming Initiatives

In 2016, PCTV continued to build on the progress made in 2015 to improve programming variety and quality. Over the course of the year PCTV staff produced 115 separate programs totaling 66.7 hours of new programming. Those efforts included the following:

- Continued coverage of Pittsburgh Public Schools board meetings. PCTV staff records the meetings and delivers them for air on PCTV and the City of Pittsburgh Channel.
- Production of 8 regularly produced programs including Into Pittsburgh, Art Happens, UFOs Over Pittsburgh, Political Jungle, A + Schools, Indie Film Forum, Pittsburgh Makers, and Hugh Shows
- Coverage of 18 Pittsburgh non-profits on "Into Pittsburgh" including GASP,
 Kelly-Strayhorn Theater, National Aviary, Allies for Children, Edgewood
 Symphony, Trade Institute of Pittsburgh, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Our
 Clubhouse, Pittsburgh Zoo, InvolveMint, Veterans Breakfast Club, 412 Food
 Rescue, Greater Pittsburgh Nonprofit Partnership, Beverly's Birthdays, Northside
 Food Pantry, Community Auto, Sara Heinz House, and the Pittsburgh Equal
 Opportunity Review Commission.
- Live nine-hour coverage of the Deutschtown Music Festival on the North Side.
- Interviews with local artists on Greater Pittsburgh Arts Council's "Art Happens" including Rachel Klipa, Edith Abeyta, Jeb Feldman, Eric Shiner, Kilolo Luckett, Alisha Wormsley, Shaunda Miles, Tereneh Mosley, Kahmeela Adams, Amber Epps, Lauren Goshinski, Clayton Merrell, Eric Sloss, Juan Fernandez, and Boom Concepts.
- Interviews with local filmmakers on "Indie Film Forum" including Chris Ivey, Chris Mason, Lynne Squilla, Marcus Rediker, Tony Buba, and Keith Reimink.

- Interviews with local political figures on "Political Jungle" including Jim Roddy, David Wecht, Heather Heidelbaugh, Mitch Kates, Eugene DePasquale, Natalia Rudiak and Dan Gilman.
- Interviews with local makers on "Pittsburgh Makers" including Charles Page and Dennis Bergevin.
- Coverage of issues affecting education in Pittsburgh on A + Schools. We produced 11 new episodes in 2016.
- Interviews and musical performances of local bands on "Hugh Shows" including Bastard Bearded Irishmen, Morgan Erina, Different Places in Space, Andre Costello and the Cool Minors, Emily Rodgers Band, Sleep Experiments, Ladyfest Pittsburgh 2016, Deutschtown Music Festival, Pat DiCesare, and Zak Kane.
- Continued airing of "Road to Recovery", a health program for those recovering from drug and alcohol addiction.
- Continued collaboration with SLB Radio to carry the Saturday Light Brigade program every Saturday morning.

Public Access Services

In 2016, PCTV continued to offer a range of services designed to ensure equal access to our resources for the production and distribution of community-oriented programming. One notable change was a new policy allowing Allegheny County residents who do not live within city limits to utilize PCTV for a higher fee.

Training

In 2016, we offered a range of trainings designed to teach users of all experience levels the basics of television production. Our offerings included:

- Orientation, an overview of how to get involved at PCTV. The class is scheduled once per month and by appointment.
- Producer Prep, a preparatory class for those who want to become community producers.
- Electronic Field Production, an introduction to the art of shooting on-location video with our Panasonic HMC 80 cameras.
- Intro to Final Cut Pro X, an introduction to digital non-linear editing on Apple iMac computers.

For the fifth year in a row, we also offered a television production summer camp for teenagers. Students learned how to operate studio equipment, field cameras, and editing equipment.

In 2016, PCTV:

Offered a total of 38 classes to a total of 175 class registrants.

• Issued 85 training certifications.

Facilities and Equipment

After the major renovation completed in 2015, 2016 was a relatively quiet year in terms of improvements to facilities and equipment. There are, however, a few noteworthy developments to point to:

- Received and implemented equipment donations including a teleprompter and 8 display monitors.
- New sign installed on the exterior of the building by the landlord at no cost to PCTV.
- Room identifier signs added.
- A new HVAC unit was installed on the rooftop at no cost to PCTV.
- New chairs were added in the lobby.
- Our office server was moved to the cloud to save money and improve reliability.

PCTV uses its facility and equipment to give the community a voice in local media. We do that by providing local residents and nonprofits with the means to produce and distribute noncommercial television programming. Available equipment includes video cameras, tripods, and microphones available for checkout, an edit lab with iMac computers loaded with Final Cut Pro editing software, and a fully equipped studio with three HD cameras, production switcher, and lighting grid. We have plans to equip the newly built second studio in 2017. PCTV's server room houses our broadcast equipment which includes an HD router, video server, and streaming computer, all of which enable the distributing of programming via cable and internet. A full inventory of currently available equipment is attached as an addendum to this report.

What follows is an overview of equipment and facility usage at PCTV in 2016:

Outreach and Promotional Activities

In 2016, PCTV undertook a number of promotional efforts designed to promote participation and viewership. Our activities included:

- Running \$30,000 worth of donated commercial time on Comcast in Pittsburgh. Our commercial promoted the opportunity for residents to learn production skills and produce their own programming.
- A feature article in the Post-Gazette highlighting the completion of our renovation project and new programming.
- Active participation as a member of the North Side/Northshore Chamber of Commerce.
- Active participation with the Community Bridge Builders Network.
- Promotion of PCTV at 18 community events including: Sugar Top/Schenley
 Heights Community Day, Highland Park Festival, Lincoln/Larimer Community
 Day, Banksville Community Day/Festival, Morningside Community Day, Hill
 District Appreciation Day, Edgewood Community Day, Squirrel Hill/Beechwood
 Block Party, Stanton Heights Community Day, Fairywood Community Day, Troy
 Hill Community Day, Beltzhoover Community Day, Glenwood Community Day,
 Deutschtown Music Festival, Garfield Community Day, Back to School event,
 Bakery Square Urban Beach Party Event, and Bedford Dwellings Community
 Day.
- PCTV conducted two community food drives.

Financial Resources

In 2016, we continued our efforts to generate new sources of revenue while making financial accountability one of our highest priorities. PCTV's 2016 Audited Financial Statements are included with this report. Some highlights of PCTV financial performance for 2016 include:

- Attracting \$39,900 in Special Project Income, which represent amounts earned for production for hire.
- \$6,515 in donations.
- Over \$22,000 in fees from community members who use PCTV.
- \$73,680 in non-franchise income. This equates to 13.4% of our income coming from non-franchise sources.

PCTV currently has 4 board members. Board Chair Juan Garrett is the Executive Director of the Riverside Center for Innovation. Vice-President Luther Dupree is a community producer at PCTV. Pittsburgh Community Television Report on New and Enhanced Revenue Sources 2016

Overview

In 2016 PCTV continued to pursue sources of revenue above and beyond that provided by the cable franchise agreements with Comcast and Verizon. We generated \$73,680 in non-franchise revenue in 2016. The sources of revenue we are reporting on in this report include:

- 1) 4020 Foundation Grants-- grant income received from foundation services.
- 2) 4030 Special Project Income income derived from PCTV hiring out its television production services.
- 3) 4035 Producer Enrollment Fees enrollment fees from individuals and non-profits who are community producers at PCTV. Includes yearly enrollment, sixmonth enrollment and class fees.
- 4) 4040 Production Services income derived from additional services including DVD and tape duplication and rental of duplication equipment
- 5) 4045 Fundraisers/Special Events—income from any event fundraisers PCTV participates in.
- 6) 4050 Donations—donations from individual donors.
- 7) **4055 Underwriting/Sponsorship Income** contributions from businesses and non-profits in exchange for recognition as an underwriter or sponsor on PCTV.
- 8) 4065 Rental Income income from rental of PCTV facilities or equipment.
- 9) 4070 Miscellaneous Income miscellaneous income that does not easily fit into another category.
- 10) 4080 In Kind Donations -- the fair value of donated materials on the date of donation.
- 11) **4105 Sales Vending Machines** sales of food and drink items from PCTV's vending machine.
- 12) 4110 Sales Tape and Merchandise income from sales of blank DVD and tape stock and other merchandise such as t-shirts.
- 13) 4900 Interest Income—income from interest bearing bank accounts.

Income Generation Activities in 2016

The highlights of our revenue generation efforts in 2015 include the following:

- A successful donation program that generated \$6,515 in individual and in-kind donations for PCTV.
- Continued success in 4030 Special Project Income. In 2016 we generated \$39,900 in income from special projects, which represent fees paid to PCTV for video production services.

- A combined \$22,943 generated from 4035 Producer Enrollment and 4040 Production Services.
- A grant of \$660 from the Pittsburgh Foundation, representing PCTV's share of the proceeds from the Day of Giving fundraiser.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors Pittsburgh Community Television Corporation Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Pittsburgh Community Television (not-for-profit organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2016, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the organization's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate to the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the organization's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluation of the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Pittsburgh Community Television (not-for-profit organization) as of December 31, 2016, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with auditing principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

Pittsburgh Community Television Corporation (PCTV) is a not-for-profit corporation whose objective is to serve the people of Pittsburgh by providing public access on an equal opportunity basis to city residents. It provides training, equipment, and production services to the community for cable access, and actively advocates for Public Access and First Amendment rights. PCTV strives to be a telecommunication resource that is educational and accessible for community producers, engaging, and diverse for viewers, and provides alternatives for the community.

PCTV was incorporated as a Pennsylvania non-profit corporation, June 27, 1985, and in December 1985 received IRC §501(c)(3) designation. Consequently, contributions to PCTV are tax deductible within limitations prescribed by the Internal Revenue Code,

The office of PCTV is located at 1300 Western Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15233. The telephone number is (412) 322-7570. The website is www.pctv21.org.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

PCTV uses the accrual basis of accounting. Under this method, revenues are recorded when earned and expenses recorded when incurred without regard to the time of cash receipt or disbursement. Net assets and revenues, expenses, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

B. Financial Statement Presentation

PCTV reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets and temporarily restricted net assets summarized as follows:

<u>Unrestricted:</u> Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations. PCTV has discretionary control.

Temporarily Restricted: Net assets that are subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may or will be met, either by actions of PCTV and/or the passage of time. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. As of December 31, 2016, PCTV's temporarily restricted net assets were \$316,490.

C. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Significant estimates used in preparing these financial statements include depreciation of property and equipment, and the allocation of expenses. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

PCTV considers all highly liquid deposits available for current use with an initial maturity of ninety days or less to be cash equivalents.

E. Investments

Purchased marketable securities are carried at fair value. Donated marketable securities are recorded at fair value on the date of donation and carried at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Gains and investment income are recognized in the period earned and are classified as unrestricted or temporarily restricted with respect to the stipulations established by the donor at the date of donation or applicable state law.

F. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment acquired with a basis of \$500 or greater are recorded at cost when purchased. Expenditures for renewals and improvements that significantly extend the useful life of an asset are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are expensed. Gains and losses on disposition of property and equipment are reflected in income. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

Depreciation expense amounted to \$94,873 for the year ended December 31, 2016.

G. Impairment of Long-Lived Assets

Long-lived assets are reviewed for impairment when circumstances indicate the carrying value of an asset may not be recovered. For assets that are to be held and used, impairment is recognized when the estimated undiscounted cash flows associated with the asset or group of assets is less than their carrying value. If impairment exists, an adjustment is made to write the asset down to its fair value, and a loss is recorded as the difference between the carrying value and fair value. Fair values are determined based on quoted market values, discounted cash flows, or internal and external appraisals, as applicable. Assets to be disposed of are carried at the lower of carrying value or estimated net realizable value.

H. Support and Revenue Recognition

Support including unconditional promises to give, are recognized as revenues in the period received. Contributions subject to donor-imposed stipulations that are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support. Promises to give that are scheduled to be received after the financial position date are shown as increases in temporarily restricted net assets and are reclassified to unrestricted net assets when the purpose or time restriction is met. Conditional promises to give are not recognized until they become unconditional; that is, when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. Contributions of assets other than cash are recorded at their estimated fair value. Contributions to be received after one year, if any, are discounted at the appropriate rate commensurate with risks involved.

I. Donated Services and Materials

When services are donated to PCTV by interested parties in the course of carrying out its mission, in general, no amounts are reflected in the financial statements for those services since generally there is no objective basis to measure the value of such services. In limited circumstances, however, objectively measurable donated services are recorded. These donated services must require specialized skills, be provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically be purchased if not provided by donation. PCTV received \$-0- in donated services during the year under audit.

Donated materials are recorded at their fair value at the date of the donation. PCTV received \$5,141 in donated materials during the year under audit.

These donations are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets unless the donor has restricted the donated asset to a specific purpose.

J. Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined that PCTV is exempt from federal income taxes under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and files an IRS Form 990. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is recorded in the accompanying financial statements.

As a tax-exempt organization, no part of PCTV's net assets can inure to the benefit of any private individual. In the event PCTV is dissolved and liquidated, the net assets, after paying all liabilities, would be distributed to a similar tax-exempt organization, which in the judgment of the Board of Directors, has a purpose clearly allied to that of PCTV's.

PCTV accounts for uncertainty in income taxes using a recognition threshold of more-likely-thannot to be sustained upon examination by the appropriate taxing authority. Measurement of the tax uncertainty occurs if the recognition threshold is met. Management determined that there were no tax uncertainties that met the recognition threshold in fiscal year 2016. PCTV's Annual IRS Form 990 is subject to review for three years subsequent to the date filed.

K. Fair Value Measurement

A fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation methods is used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that PCTV has the ability to access.
- Level 2 -Quoted prices in markets that are not active, or inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement (i.e. supported with little or no market activity).

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

PCTV, using available market information and appropriate valuation methodologies, has determined the estimated fair value of any financial instruments. However, considerable judgment is required in interpreting data to develop the estimates of fair value. The fair values of any PCTV's financial instruments are estimated based on current market rates and instruments with the same risk and maturities.

L. Concentration of Credit and Market Risk

Financial instruments that expose PCTV to concentrations of credit and market risk consist primarily of cash equivalents. Cash equivalents are maintained at high-quality financial institutions and PCTV has not experienced any loss on its cash equivalents.

M. Advertising

PCTV uses advertising to promote its programs and services. Advertising and promotional costs are expensed as incurred. For the year ended December 31, 2016 advertising expense was \$4,335.

N. Subsequent Events

PCTV has evaluated all events through the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that there are no subsequent events that require recognition or disclosure.

O. FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES

The costs of providing the various programs and other services of the Organization have been summarized on a functional basis in the Statement of Activities. Program and support services are detailed on the Schedule of Functional Expenses. Two methods of expense allocation have been used. Each line on the statement of functional expenses has been labeled with the allocation method used.

- 1. Overall Based upon estimated time expended by staff.
- 2. Actual The line item could be specifically identified with a function.

NOTE 3: FUNCTIONAL CATEGORIES

A. PROGRAM SERVICES

- Production Expenses related to PCTV's production of television programs that are targeted towards community need.
- Programming Expenses related to scheduling the programs submitted for airing on PCTV's television channel.
- 3. Outreach Expenses related to outreach into the community to underserved groups, including youth.
- 4. Public Access Expenses related to assisting community producers and non-profit organizations in the production of television programming.

B. SUPPORT SERVICES

- 1. Management and General These are costs not identified with a single function, but are indispensable to the operation of the Organization.
- 2. Fund Raising This includes the cost specifically related to raising moneys for PCTV.

NOTE 4: RETIREMENT PLAN

The Organization makes available a Simple IRA retirement account for full-time regular employees. The Organization contributed \$6,235 to this plan, which matches employee contributions to a maximum of 3% of the qualifying salary. Consistent with the plan rules, employees may elect to have amounts contributed to the fund on a tax deferred salary reduction basis, as specified within IRS guidelines.

NOTE 5: LINES OF CREDIT & SHORT TERM NOTES

The Organization maintains a line of credit from a financial institution with a \$75,000 limit. At year-end the interest rate was 5.50% per annum. At year-end the line was closed with a \$-0-balance.

The Organization maintains a line of credit from a financial institution with a \$150,000 limit. At year-end the interest rate was 4.00% per annum. At year-end there was no outstanding balance.

The Organization borrowed \$9,700 for insurance payments for 2016-2017. At year-end the interest rate was 7.900% per annum. At year-end there was an outstanding balance of \$8,450.

NOTE 6: LOANS

In December of 2014 the Organization arranged a development fund loan with a \$75,000 limit and an interest rate of 7.00% per annum. At year-end the loan was closed with no outstanding balance.

In July of 2014 the organization also arranged a bank loan with a \$250,600 limit and an interest rate of 3.990% per annum. At year-end the loan was closed with no outstanding balance.

In December of 2016 the Organization arranged a bank loan with a \$279,000 limit and an interest rate of 4.00%. At year-end the outstanding balance was \$272,749. The loan requires collateralization in the form of business assets i.e. a \$100,000 certificate of deposit held by the granting bank. The required principal payments are as follows:

NOTE 7: PUBLIC, EDUCATIONAL AND GOVERNMENT (PEG) CHANNEL ADMINISTRATOR On November 1, 2013, PCTV was contracted by the City of Pittsburgh as the PEG Channel Administrator. The City agrees to provide funds to PCTV in the amounts and in the manner set forth in §12.1 of the agreement and assign control and management of certain access facilities and resources. At year-end, the "Annual PEG Grants" provided a accrued remittance of \$548,570.
