## Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Pittsburgh as follows:

**Section 1.** The Mayor and/or the Director of the Department of Public Safety or Director of the Department of General Services, on behalf of the City of Pittsburgh, are hereby authorized to advertise for proposals and to award and enter into an Agreement or Agreements, or use existing Agreements and/or Contract or Contracts, or use existing Contracts for the purchase of communications equipment and related accessories at a cost not to exceed Ninety Seven Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$97,200) chargeable to and payable from Account 543600, Fund 5100, Subclass PGHPR, Project/Grant 2267109, Budget Year 2000, Department of Public Safety.
