WHEREAS, the National Animal Control Association has designated the second week of April each year as **Animal Control Officer Appreciation Week**; and
WHEREAS, the various Federal, State, and Local Government Officials throughout the Country take this time to recognize, thank, and commend all **Animal Control Officers** for the dedicated service they provide to the citizens, various Public Safety, Public Service Agencies and Departments throughout the Country; and
WHEREAS, the Pittsburgh **Bureau of Animal Care & Control** provides assistance to the employees of the Public Safety Department, other City Departments and the Allegheny County Health Department in situations involving animals, both domestic and wild; and
WHEREAS, the Bureau assists the Pennsylvania Game Commission in the tracking of the rabies virus; enforces the Dangerous Dog Law; it enforces City and State codes dealing with animals; issues citations and appears in court; keeps City parks animal-nuisance free; works with non-profit animal shelters; and provides consultation to other municipalities concerning animal issues; and
WHEREAS, **Animal Control Officers** capture stray animals, assist in pet/owner recovery, resolve neighbor disputes over animals, assist the elderly and physically-challenged with animal concerns, advise and teach residents of their responsibility as pet owners, advise non-pet owners of their rights, capture and release State and non-State-mandated wildlife, as well as the capture of domestic animals and wildlife. The Bureau also quarantines animals, provides removal of deceased animals and assists police and the District Attorney's office with inhumane investigations;
