WHEREAS from September 20<sup>th</sup> through September 24<sup>th</sup> of this year, the 139<sup>th</sup> Session of the Pittsburgh Annual Conference of the African Methodist Episcopal Church will be held at the Radisson Hotel located in Greentree; and
