**WHEREAS**, Butler Street and Lawrenceville have become heavily trafficked communities, Cathy ensures the safety of school children, adults, cyclists, and motorists while doing her best to brighten their day, and;

**WHEREAS**, Cathy was recognized in the Trib, KDKA'S Kidsburgh, and ImaginePgh for her unique approach to her profession as a crossing guard, and;

**WHEREAS**, Cathy has volunteered on the Lawrenceville United AdvantAGE Steering Committee, helping to plan events and programs to care for older adults in Lawrenceville, and;
