**WHEREAS**, the first exhibit is in honor of Black History Month and features the work of Brandon Jennings, Ashante Josey, Marlon Gist, Douglas Webster, Irene Sparks, Kellye Jean Dawson-Young, Baba Amir Rashiid, Jamie Acie Sr, Ernest Bey, Hurley Charles Nance, and Theresa Rose Monroe; and,

**WHEREAS**, the annual Pittsburgh Paints calendar includes Women’s History Month, Pittsburgh K-12 Student Art, Asian-Pacific American Heritage Month and Jewish American Heritage Month, LGBTQ+ Pride Month, Photography, Black Business Month + American Artists Appreciation Month, National Latinx/Hispanic Heritage Month, Breast Cancer Awareness Month, Holiday Theme and a theme Inspired by the City of Pittsburgh; and,
