*WHEREAS*, over the past three years, the City of Pittsburgh has received a total of \$53 million in CDBG funds and has funded a variety of projects that have directly benefited our citizens and neighborhoods; and,

*WHEREAS*, over the past three years, Pittsburgh City Council and the Mayor’s Office awarded over \$4 million in CDBG funds to area nonprofits that provide vital public services to the Pittsburgh community;

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED*, that the City of Pittsburgh designates the week of April 11-15, 2022, as **National Community Development Week** in support of this valuable program that has made tremendous contributions to the viability of the housing stock, infrastructure, public services, and the economic well-being of our city; and,

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED*, that Pittsburgh City Council urges the United States Congress and the Biden Administration to recognize the outstanding work being done locally and nationally with CDBG by supporting increased funding for the program in FY 2023.
