WHEREAS, Since its founding on December 4, 1906, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. has supplied voice and vision to the struggle of African-Americans and people of color around the world. Alpha Phi Alpha, the first intercollegiate Greek-letter fraternity established for African-Americans, was founded at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York by seven college men who recognized the need for a strong bond of brotherhood among African descendants in this country; and,

WHEREAS, The Fraternity initially served as a study and support group for minority students who faced racial prejudice, both educationally and socially, at Cornell. The early leaders of the now internationally recognized fraternity succeeded in laying a firm foundation for Alpha Phi Alpha, by creating principles of scholarship, fellowship, good character, and the uplifting of humanity; and,

WHEREAS, Members of the prominent African-American society known as Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. have long uplifted humanity for the betterment of all citizens. A few members that bear the sacred name of Alpha Phi Alpha are Martin Luther King, Jr., former Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall, W.E.B. DuBois, Jesse Owens, Ambassador Raphael Lanier, Cornel West, John H. Johnson, Duke Ellington, Hill Harper, Julius Chambers, Dick Gregory, Marc Morial, first black Mayor of Atlanta Maynard Jackson, first black Mayor of New York City David Dinkins, and Pittsburghers Max Starx, Jake Milliones, Robert L. Vann, Byrd Brown, Wendell Freeland, Homer S. Brown, and Bishop Charles Foggie, just to name a few; and,

WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Association of Alpha Chapters convened their statewide meeting in the "most livable city", Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on November 12 through November 14, 2010. Alpha Phi Alpha members engage the fraternity's role in shaping our commonwealth's political landscape, and helping move us closer to bringing equality, freedom, and justice to the residents of our Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and,

WHEREAS, The fraternity, through its college and alumni chapters, serves the community through more than 600 chapters in the United States, Europe and the Caribbean. Alpha Phi Alpha also has a very rich history in the City of Pittsburgh, with its 14<sup>th</sup> national chapter, Omicron, being founded at the University of Pittsburgh in 1913;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Pittsburgh does hereby commend The Pennsylvania Association of Alpha Chapters for the critical impact it holds on the future of our City of Pittsburgh and for hosting the "PAAC Statewide Conference" event in the City of Pittsburgh.
