WHEREAS, a strong economy is based on a diversity of industries and fair wages for all workers; and

WHEREAS, 60,000 members of the Service Employees International Union (SEIU) Local 32BJ are in contract negotiations in major cities across the Northeastern United States with the multi-billion dollar commercial real estate industry, and are striving to maintain their standard of living; and

**WHEREAS**, union janitors earn family-sustaining wages, enabling them to provide for their families, offer stability in their communities, and contribute to the health, wealth and welfare of our city; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 28, 2011 in Philadelphia, and over the coming weeks in Pittsburgh and throughout our region, the members of **SEIU Local 32BJ** will rally for good jobs and strong communities; and

**WHEREAS**, the **Pittsburgh City Council** recognizes the significant role that middle-class and low-wage workers play in the City of Pittsburgh, strengthening our economy, providing tax revenue, and delivering much-needed services; and

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Council of the City of Pittsburgh, does, hereby, stand with the janitors of SEIU Local 32BJ as they rally in Philadelphia and Pittsburgh to maintain middle-class jobs in the service sector, and to make the American Dream possible for thousands of people in our region.
