WHEREAS, Erica Upshaw-Givner, LCSW and a University of Pittsburgh alumna, founded **Vision Towards Peace LLC** in 2012 with a mission to provide generational wellness one person at a time and a passion to serve the community in which she was raised; and,

WHEREAS, Erica works hard to provide a culturally sensitive atmosphere while encouraging healthy dialogue and overall healing; she is committed to combating the stereotypical stigma attached to African American's seeking mental health wellness; and,

WHEREAS, Erica Upshaw-Givner has had a variety of experiences in the Mental Health field which has led her to a number of collaborations including Allegheny County Pretrial Services Supervision Unit, local Greater Pittsburgh Re-Employment Transition Centers and local family health practices to address the connection between physical and mental health; and,
