WHEREAS, born and raised in Pittsburgh, Deborah "Debbie" Friedman was trained as a Physician Assistant at the Medical College of Wake Forest University, later practiced in both in-patient and out-patient psychiatric settings, and then, returned to Pittsburgh, working in the community development sector, and;
