Smile because it happened!” **Susan Segall Gross**, affectionately known as Susie, was born in Miami and raised in Wilmington, Delaware, attended Morris Harvey College/University of Charleston, where she earned an Early Childhood teaching degree which prepared her for her life’s work and a lasting legacy; and,

She proved to be an extraordinary teacher, forging relationships with toddlers that lasted into childhood and creating bonds with their families. She put everything she had into the J.C.C. Pre-School and every ounce of compassion and love into the children; and,

**WHEREAS**, in addition to her devotion to the children and families of the JCC Pre-School, **Susie Gross** left an irreplaceable memory for everyone who knew her.
