**WHEREAS**, NAWIC currently serves approximately 5,500 members in 190 chapters in the United States and Canada, as well as affiliates in Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa; and,

**WHEREAS**, NAWIC provides its members with opportunities for professional development, education, networking, leadership training, public service and more; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Pittsburgh area Chapter 161 of NAWIC was first chartered on March 29, 1969 with 33 founding members, and now includes women who are actively employed in all aspects of the construction industry, such as business owners, managers, consultants, tradeswomen, operators, architects, accountants and attorneys; and,
