WHEREAS, George Thomas was a community organizer and active member of the Hazelwood community. George was an associate with Jackson/Clark Partners where he promoted resident led outreach for many projects across the city and helped collect neighborhood data through the community census; and,

WHEREAS, he was also a United States Army veteran, mentor, community leader, Hazelwood Initiative board member, and father; and,

WHEREAS, the Memorial Clean Up & Build Day on May 18th will celebrate the lives of **Rena** and **George** and further cement the impact that both residents had on the community; and,
