**WHEREAS**, the **2020 Lunar New Year** marks the arrival of the Year of the Rat and begins on January 25, 2020, or the first day of the new year according to the lunisolar calendar and extends until the full moon 15 days later ;and,

**WHEREAS**, the **Lunar New Year** is the largest global holiday predominately celebrated by Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese and other Asian communities in Pittsburgh and around the world including China, Korea, Vietnam, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Tiber, Macau, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore , Taiwan, Thailand, Bhutan and Mongolia ; and,

**WHEREAS**, in Pittsburgh,, the 2020 Lunar New Year of the Metal Rat Celebration is sponsored and produced by many partners including the Organization of Chinese Americans (OCA-Pittsburgh), St. Edmund's Academy, the Squirrel Hill Urban Coalition, Tzu Chi Academy of Pittsburgh, Children's Museum and the Pittsburgh Chinese Restaurant Association (PCRA), with all working to promote civic goals, foster pride in the heritage and traditions and raise awareness by showcasing culinary and cultural events at St. Edmund's Academy, the Children's Museum and culminating with a parade through Squirrel Hill.
