Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Pittsburgh as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor, through the City Solicitor, is hereby authorized to enter into a Full and Final Release releasing the City of Pittsburgh from any and all liability in connection with any fees owed to Bryan Campbell, Esquire, for alleged monies owed to him for professional services provided to City of Pittsburgh professional police officers/FOP Members who were named as parties to lawsuits filed in state or federal court as described in a lawsuit filed in the Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas at G.D. 19-007775.
