Resolution authorizing the filing of an application for federal assistance with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for a \$196,000 Economic Development Initiative (EDI) - Special Project Grant for the South Side Works project. (Council District 3).

## Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Pittsburgh as follows:

**Section 1.** The Mayor, on behalf of the City of Pittsburgh, is hereby authorized to execute and file an Application for Federal Assistance, a program narrative and certifications and assurances required by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for a \$196,000 Economic Development Initiative (EDI) - Special Project Grant for the South Side Works project.

**Section 2.** Upon approval by HUD of the application, the Mayor, on behalf of the City, is authorized to execute a grant agreement and any other necessary or appropriate documents required by HUD in connection with the EDI grant, which agreements shall be in a form approved by the City Solicitor.

**Section 3.** Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh is hereby designated as the City's agent for administration of the EDI grant and is authorized to draw down funds directly from HUD.
