**WHEREAS**, Pittsburgh Steelers legend Jerome Bettis was selected to the Pro Bowl six times, named a First Team All-Pro twice, earned the Rookie of the Year, Comeback Player of the Year, and Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award in 1993, 1996, and 2001, respectively; and,

**WHEREAS**, over the course of his storied career, “The Bus” scored 91 touchdowns and racked up 13,662 rushing yards, which is eighth on the NFL’s all-time rushing list. During the 2005 season, Jerome carried the Steelers to their fifth Super Bowl victory in his native Detroit. In 2015, he was enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame; and,

**WHEREAS**, Jerome established the Bus Stops Here Foundation in 1997, and since that time, his generosity has changed the lives of countless children and adults in Detroit, Pittsburgh, and beyond; and,

**WHEREAS**, through Jerome’s leadership and the tireless work and passion of his dynamic team, including Beth Vietmeier, Gloria Bettis, Alexis Leyh, Kiley Dugan, and Frankie Grenick, the Foundation connects young people to opportunities to help them become healthy, confident, and productive members of society; and,
