WHEREAS, this year, as he celebrates his 10<sup>th</sup> season as Artistic Director of Pittsburgh Public Theater and his 17<sup>th</sup> season of close association with the company as a Director, **Ted Pappas** continues to excel as a versatile leader, possessing artistic and business talents that have made the **Pittsburgh Public Theater** such a success; **WHEREAS**, **Ted Pappas** has staged 32 productions for the **Pittsburgh Public Theater** encompassing an extraordinary range of styles and periods from Euripides to Sweeney Todd;
