Resolution authorizing the Director of Public Safety and the Chief of Police to enter into a grant agreement with the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance (DOJ) to receive monies from the 2010 Justice Assistance Grant Program, and further authorizing legitimate expenditures by the Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Police for purchases authorized by the Grant Agreement and for the execution of agreement(s),or contract(s) for any equipment or services required in connection with the execution of said Grant Agreement. Said agreement(s) or contract(s) shall not \$287,266.00. Account 600000, fund 2445, organization code 230000, subcode 600, budget year 2011, Department of Public Safety - Bureau of Police.

## Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Pittsburgh as follows:

**Section 1.** The Director of Public Safety and the Chief of Police, on behalf of the Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Police, are hereby authorized to enter into a Grant Agreement with the DOJ for the receipt of grant monies in the amount of two hundred eighty seven thousand, two hundred sixty six dollars (\$287,266.00). These funds will be used to support the Pittsburgh Bureau of Police with purchasing equipment and services to better address crime and enhance law enforcement capabilities. Funds will be in fund: 2445, organization code 230000, account: 600000, subcode 600, budget year 2011.

**Section 2.** The Director of Public and Chief of Police, on behalf of the City of Pittsburgh, Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Police, is hereby further authorized to enter into agreement or agreements, contract or contracts, and to make all legitimate expenditures required under the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement with the DOJ as outlined in Section 1 of this resolution. Said agreement(s), contract(s), or expenditures shall not exceed two hundred eighty seven thousand, two hundred and sixty six dollars (\$287,266.00). These funds will be used to support the Pittsburgh Bureau of Police with purchasing equipment and services to better address crime and enhance law enforcement capabilities.
