Admitted to the Bar in 1951, Mr. Freeland has had a distinguished legal career and was also a Founding Member of the Hill House Association and the Squirrel Hill Urban Coalition; and,

*WHEREAS*, Treasure Rabbi James A Gibson is celebrating his 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary as the spiritual leader of Temple Sinai, where he has supported and promoted the congregation's Family of Families through his learned teaching and his passionate commitment to social justice in the Jewish community and beyond. Rabbi Gibson chairs the Jewish Unity Project and co-convenes the Priest-Rabbi Dialogue sponsored by the Diocese of Pittsburgh. A graduate of the University of Michigan and ordained at the Hebrew Union College, Jewish Institute of Religion, Rabbi Gibson also holds a Master of Arts in Hebrew Letters and an honorary Doctorate of Divinity, is adjunct faculty at Chatham University and is presently a Rabbinic Fellow in the Institute of Jewish Spirituality; and,
