Officer Hodges became well known throughout the North Side for his tireless work ethic, dependability, and his selfless commitment to serve the People of the City of Pittsburgh; and,

WHEREAS, Officer Hodges' commitment to service often extended beyond his official duties as a law enforcement officer. For several years he has spent Thanksgiving Day delivering turkey dinners to families in need with his fellow police officers, through the 'Get Stuffed with Love' program; and,

WHEREAS, On October 3, 2014, after twenty (20) years of excellent service, Officer Hodges proudly retired from the City of Pittsburgh Bureau of Police. Selfless work from dedicated professionals likes Officer Hodges and officers like him, help to make our city a safer place for all to work, play, and live. He will be sorely missed; and,
