WHEREAS, the AGC is the leading association for the construction industry, representing more than 26,000 firms; and,

WHEREAS, the conference will showcase new safety training programs and products, and attendees will receive updates on the latest initiatives from Occupational Safety & Health Administration (OSHA) and other industry experts; and,

WHEREAS, the AGC chose Pittsburgh thanks to the safety image that regional commercial contractors have built over the years. The Master Builders' Association was among the first trade associations in the country to emphasize safety and hire a full-time safety expert, even before the federal government launched OSHA in 1971; and,
