**WHEREAS**, he is also a member of the Sheraden Kiwanis Club and serves on the Board of Directors for the Goodwill Housing Board, currently as President; and

**WHEREAS**, Wayne and his wife, Kathie are the proud parents of 2 sons and have 4 grandchildren with whom he is looking forward to spending more time with after his retirement on June 30, 2019; and,
