*WHEREAS*, always a hard worker, Anna has always put her family first and is enormously caring to others; she still lives in Sheraden and enjoys crocheting, bingo, working the polls, traveling with friends, playing cards, watching the Pirates, and being involved in the community and at Holy Innocents Church; and,

*WHEREAS*, the esteem she is held in is evident today as her family celebrated her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday with a surprise party at Clever Park on June 9 with her many friends to honor her; and,
