*WHEREAS*, an avid storyteller, Olafemi enjoys sharing the history of her dishes such as fried cheese, which pays homage to the African legacy of raising goats and watermelon, a cultural staple. She believes it is important for people to know the origins of where foods came from, why they are part of their culture and how culture influences market trends; and,

*WHEREAS*, Ms. Mandley plans on launching "Joseph's Table", a 5-7 course dinner at her underground Supper Club, Rum crafted cocktails, as well as hosting Pop Ups throughout Pittsburgh's community and art festivals; and,
