She was a Cub Scout Den Mother and a Brownie Group Leader and raised two successful children, Dr. Robert "Bobby" Baraff, a neurologist who graduated from the University of Pittsburgh Medical School, and Marjorie "Marjie" Baraff, a Ph.D in Institutional Policy from the University of Pittsburgh who taught at the Pitt Dental School and was on the Pitt's Women's Swim Team. Adalyn spent many hours attending her children's and later her four grandchildren's athletic events and has been a grand-babysitter extraordinaire and is now Great Grandmother to nine; and,

WHEREAS, outside of the home, Adalyn Baraff worked in the family business,

Baraff Brother's Furniture Store in East Liberty. She also worked in the office at the Armour Meat Packing Company, was a super saleswoman at Kaufmann's Department Store and at Saks Fifth Avenue. She was active in several civic organizations such as National Council of Jewish Women and served as an Officer at Eastern Star and ORT. Adalyn was an active member of the Amelia Earhart and the Babe Didrikson Zaharias Fan Clubs.
